**A**T the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 10th October 1817,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT** in Council.

**W**HEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the thirty-first of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunpowder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of November next; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth day of November next), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to enforce the law for empowering His Majesty

to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Jas. **I**T is ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Monday the third day of November next, be further prorogued to Tuesday the sixteenth day of December next.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

**W**HEREAS We have thought fit to order that certain pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called "half sovereigns,

or ten shilling pieces," each of which should be of the value of ten shillings, and that each piece should be of the weight of two pennyweights thirteen grains  $\frac{6,370}{10,000}$  troy weight of standard gold, according to the weights approved of and confirmed by Us in Council, in pursuance of an Act made in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating and ascertaining the weights to be made use of in weighing the gold and silver coin of this kingdom;" and We have further thought fit to order that every such piece of gold money, so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression the head of His Majesty, with the inscription "Georgius III. Dei Gratia:" and the date of the year; and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom, contained in a shield, with the inscription "Britanniarum Rex. Fid. Def.:" with a newly invented graining on the edge of the piece: and whereas pieces of gold money of the above description have been coined at His Majesty's Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of Orders which We have given for that purpose: We have therefore, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Proclamation; and We do hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, ordain, declare, and command, that the said pieces of gold money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall be called "half sovereigns or ten shilling pieces," and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and every of such pieces, not weighing less than two penny weights, thirteen grains and one quarter, shall pass and be received as of the value of ten shillings of lawful money of Great Britain and Ireland in all payments whatsoever.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the tenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, in the fifty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY GUINEAS is hereby offered to any person or persons (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; or to any person or persons who shall apprehend and bring the offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.—Twenty guineas of the above reward to be paid by Mr. W. W. Salmon, Treasurer of the Devises Society for the Prosecution of Felons, and thirty guineas by the said Messrs. Thomas and James Hull.

As a further encouragement, the Justices of the Peace of the county of Wilts, feeling at all times a most anxious wish to assist in the detection of crimes and protection of property, and moved in the present instance, by the peculiar enormity, cruelty, and malice of the offences above stated, do hereby offer one reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS (in addition to the reward offered by Mr. Hull and Mr. Rolfe), to be paid to any person who will give such information as may lead to the detection and apprehension of the offender or offenders in any one of the above cases, the same to be paid after the trial of the offender or offenders, on application to

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of **FIFTY POUNDS** is hereby offered by the said Mr. Timothy Burstall, to any person or persons (except as is before excepted) who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof, or to any person who shall apprehend and bring the offenders, or any of them, to conviction, or cause them, or any of them, so to be apprehended and convicted as aforesaid.

#### BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

**W**Hereas by an Act passed in the forty-seventh year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to allow, for two years from and after the passing of this Act, an additional bounty on double-refined sugar, and to extend former bounties on other refined sugar, to such as shall be pounded, crushed, or broken; and to allow, for one year, certain bounties on British plantation raw sugar exported," reciting, that whereas by the laws now in force in Great Britain and Ireland respectively, it is required that refined sugar exported for the bounties shall be in lumps or loaves, complete and whole; and that it is expedient that the said bounties shall be continued to be allowed and paid on the exportation of the same from the ports of London and Dublin, although such lumps or loaves may be pounded, crashed, or broken; it is enacted, that on the due exportation of refined sugar for the bounties under those laws, the same bounties respectively shall be allowed and paid under the provisions and regulations of those Acts, on such lumps and loaves as may be pounded, crashed, or broken, under the regulations of this Act; and whereas by the said Act, it is further enacted, that whenever it shall be made appear to the satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury for the time being, in Great Britain or Ireland respectively, that

proper refineries are established and carried on at or near to any port of the United Kingdom, to which it would be safe in their judgment to extend the benefit granted by this Act to the ports of London and Dublin, it shall and may be lawful for the Lord High Treasurer, or the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in Great Britain or Ireland respectively, to declare, that the regulations of this Act shall be extended to such port, provided that no bounty shall be paid or allowed upon refined sugar or candy exported from any such port, unless and until the Lord High Treasurer, or the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in Great Britain or Ireland respectively, shall have signified their approbation thereof by publication in the London or Dublin Gazette respectively; and from and after the day mentioned in such publication, all and every the provisions, powers, authorities, penalties, forfeitures, regulations, acts, matters, and things in this Act contained, or any way relating to the allowance of the bounties on such lump or loaf sugar pounded, crashed, or broken, or on sugar candy in pursuance thereof, shall extend and be construed to extend to the port or ports named in such order, in like manner, in every respect, and as fully and amply to all intents and purposes, as if such port or ports had been expressly named in this Act: and whereas it has been made appear to our satisfaction, that proper refineries are established and carried on in the port of Dundee, in that part of the United Kingdom called Scotland, and it is in our judgment safe to extend to the said port the benefit granted by the said Act to the ports of London and Dublin, We, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do therefore, pursuance to the said Act, hereby declare, that the regulations of the said Act shall, from the day of the date hereof, be extended to the said port of Dundee.

#### POST HORSE DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, London, October 25, 1817.

Each district will be put up at the sum above set opposite thereto. The highest bidder will be

declared the farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank notes, seven and a half per cent. upon the annual rent as a deposit; if no sufficient bidding shall be made for any district, it will be withdrawn.

The farmer of each district will be required to give bond, with three or more sureties, in the penalty of half the annual rent, for securing the payment of the rent and the performance of his contract.

And it is intended, that the districts shall be put up in any order which the Commissioners of tamps may think fit, and which will not be declared before the time of letting.

All persons intending to bid for any of the said duties, are to deliver in their proposals, addressed to the Commissioners at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, at least three days previous to the said 26th day of November next, signed with their names, stating the places of their abode, and specifying the district or districts for which they intend to bid, otherwise their proposals cannot be proceeded upon.
