 the said Associations and all other Associations, Covenants,  
 or Engagements whatsoever, (not directed, warranted,  
 and approved by Your Majesty) and all and every the Con-  
 vivers, Maintainers, and Abettors of any and every such  
 Associations, Covenants or Combinations; and shall endeavour  
 to discover all such as shall not declare their Abhorrence  
 and Detestation, of those and all such-like doings, being  
 justly doubtful, that if such Persons shall be per-  
 mitted publicly to poison Your Majesty's Sacred Person  
 and Life may be in great danger of destruction, and Your  
 truly Christian and Loyal Subjects brought into the  
 like Confusions they were under your most Memorials; when  
 the wicked and basest of Men  
 plundered the Bishop, imprisoned the  
 Religion, and took away the Lives of all the  
 would not cost off all true Religion and Loyalty, and  
 sincere and Disposition of Democracy, and as last  
 considered the most glorious Martyr, Your Father of happy  
 Blessed Memory, all which Miseries, we hope by  
 Your Majesty's long life, (for which we shall ever pray)  
 and the happy return of the most incomparable  
 King of Great Britain, may be prevented, and we also do pray  
 for the whole of our Kingdoms, which by  
 your means that Kingdom of Scotland (as themselves  
 acknowledge) together, and we hereby subscribing  
 this, we will upon all occasions engage our Lives and  
 Fortunes in defence of Your Majesty's Sacred Person,  
 Your Heirs and Lawful Successors; the Church of  
 England, and the Government of the Kingdom, as by  
 Law is now Established, against all and every Con-  
 trivance, and Opposition whatsoever, and when Your  
 Majesty shall please to call Your Parliament, we will  
 do our utmost endeavour to choose such Representatives  
 for the four Burroughs, as shall answer the true Inten-  
 tions of Your Majesty's Writ for their Election, and  
 Your Majesty's gracious speech at their Convening; in  
 all which, if we are not to fail, our Names hereunto sub-  
 scribed with the assistance of our Hqs. In witness  
 whereof, we have hereunto subscribed our Names,  
 and caused our Common Seal to be fixed at the General  
 Assemblies of the said Burroughs, by Adjournment  
 in the Common Hall of the said Burroughs, the Twentieth  
 day of June, in the fourth and thirtieth Year of Your  
 Majesty's reign.

**Falmouth June 22.** The 20th Instant came in  
 here the General's Merchant bound for Carolina,  
 having on board about 100 Passengers that are go-  
 ing to settle there. And the next day, the Samuel  
 of London bound with about 120 Passengers for  
 Pennsylvania; and the Prince's of London bound for  
 Guinea.

**Plimouth, June 23.** This day arrived here his  
 Majesty's Ship the *Assistance*, commanded by Sir  
 Robert Robinson in 20 days from Cadix.

**Whitehall, June 26.** This Morning the Council  
 met extraordinary, and the Lord Mayor, Alder-  
 men, and Sheriffs of London attending, and  
 giving His Majesty an Account of what had passed  
 on Saturday last at the Guildhall, and several Persons  
 having been examined upon Oath, it appeared to  
 His Majesty, That the Lord Mayor, having on the  
 24th of this Instant June called a Common-Hall,  
 for the Confirming and Electing the Sheriffs for the  
 year ensuing; and having afterwards thought fit,  
 with the Advice of the Court of Aldermen, to Ad-

journ the Common-Hall till Tuesday morning, Mr.  
 Pilkington and Mr. Shute, the Sheriffs, had not with-  
 standing gone on with the Poll, which had occasioned  
 a very great Riot.

Whereupon the two Sheriffs were by Order of  
 the Board taken into Custody by a Sergeant at Arms,  
 and committed Prisoners to the Tower by the fol-  
 lowing Warrant;

**W** Hereas it appears to his Majesty in Council,  
 upon hearing of the Lord Mayor of Lon-  
 don, and also upon the Examination of divers Wit-  
 nesses upon Oath, That Thomas Pilkington and Sa-  
 muel Shute Esquires, Sheriffs of London, upon the  
 24th of June Instant, did promote and encourage a  
 most enormous Riot within the said City, to the manifest  
 endangering of the Publick Peace; These are there-  
 fore in His Majesty's Name to require you to receive  
 into your Custody the Bodies of the said Thomas Pil-  
 kington and Samuel Shute herewith sent unto you,  
 and them safely to keep till they shall be delivered by  
 the course of Law; For which this shall be your War-  
 rant. At the Council Chamber at Whitehall the 26th  
 June 1682.

Directed to the Lieutenant of the Tower.  
 And signed by the Lords of the Council.

And it was ordered by His Majesty in Council,  
 That Mr. Attorney-General do forthwith exhibit an  
 Information in the Kings-Bench against Thomas Pil-  
 kington and Samuel Shute Esquires, Sheriffs of Lon-  
 don, and Henry Arnib Esq, one of the Aldermen  
 of the said City, and such others as upon Exami-  
 nation shall be found to have been Promoters and  
 Encouragers of the said Disorders, Riot, and that  
 he do proceed against them according to the ut-  
 most severity of Law.
