May it please your Royal Highness,

WE, His Majesty's loyal subjects, the Mayor, Sheriffs, Citizens, and Commonalty of the City of Norwich, in Common Council assembled, humbly beg leave to offer you our most hearty congratulations on the nuptials of your Royal Sister, the Princess Elizabeth, with His Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Hombourg.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, cap. 57, intituled "An General of His Majesty's Royal Marine the room of Sir George Hope, deceased.
