Dublin, July 9. N Thursday next his Grace intends to be present at a General Rendezveus of the Militia of this Province of Leinster, at the Curregh of Kildare, where 'iis believed there will be a handsome ap-Pearance. On Friday the 12 inftant, about 5 in the sfernoon, aftermuch shooting heard from the Isleof Wight, we discovered Duch Fleet of between 45 and 50 fall, (of all forts) but the wlad taking them fhort, they anchored in Sandham-Yellerday in the morning they weighed, and flood in for this place, making up within that of Southsea Cafile, but then immediately tacking, and being becalmed, they came wan Anchor, where they flaid till four in the afternoon: they then weighed again, standing toward Sandham-Bay, they then weighed again, standing toward sandham-Bay, where by reason of the calm they continued that night : about two this morning, after the filing of fome Guns, they went off to the Westwards, having not made any attempt in thele parts.

Warfam, June 26. Here has been much difcourle, that the King intended to retire himfelf from publique bufinefs, and refign his Crown, which has occasioned the publishing of feveral writings diffwading from fuch a resolution ; and th. wing the great inconveniencies that might enfue thereupon

in this present conjuncture.

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Since the late confederation of the States of the Upper and Lower Poland, in favor of the confitution of the year 1602. against the Election of any Successor to the Crown, during the life of the present King, and the prohibition under the penalty of perpetual infamy, to discourse in favour of it, (which has been fince confirmed and entred into by those of Sendomir) Several Deputies have been fince fent to the Court with an Account of their Resolutions : The high Chancellor being cholen by the Sates of Upper Poland, as their Drector with a power to command the Nobility, to put them into a posture of defence, in cale the neceffity of their affaires require it , the King is highly offended with the fe proceedings, and ordered the Bishop of Posnia to tell the Chancellor, that it was now too plain, that he was the cheif Author and contriver of what had lately passed in the Upper Poland : to which the Chancellor answered, that he was reolved to adhere firmly to the faid States, even to the h. zard of his life, which (fould he loofe it on this Account) he apposed would be effectually revenged by all the true Lovers of their Country.

The Refendary Marftein has not given that fatisfection to the States of Poland, which they expected upon his Exmins ion ; as to the point of what paffed in his Negotiation with France : he told them, his bufine's was to delire their effiftance against the Turks, which he had fuccessfully prefailed for : the States rep yed, that during the Diet, hey had follicited his Majesty to countermaund him : to which he miwered, that having not any thing to that purpole in his I fructions, nor any information of their refolve in the Diet,

they were not to blame him, but those whose bufiness it was to have better informed him. The high Chancellor having notice of what paffed between thele States and the Refendary has defired leave to return to them, but is bitherto detained. We have ftill great apprehensions of the Tartars, who give out that the Sultan Galga the Cham of Tartary is ready with 40000 men to pals into Ukrania, hoping to draw Doratzensko with the R b. Coffaques to joyn with him, which agrees with the confession of some Tartars our Pilfoners, though divers suspect fuch Rumors to have their rife from the Court : However the Grand Conftable is drawing the Army together, to lie upon the Prontiers, and is already advanced as far as Reujchlemberg.

The Sicur Gadiewsky is arrived newly from Adrianople, with Letters from the Grand Signier, full of Compliments, The Sieur Radziemski who was fent Ambeffedor to that Court, was in his return through Ukrania, unfortunately killed by the Peafants, and his luftructions fallen into theit hands, which they give out to be very prejudicial to the

Republique.

Vienna, July 3. The forcels of the French in the N:-Forces to their Affiftance, which is much preffed by the Circle of Burgundy, who have employed their Envoye hither for the fame purpoie ; whereupon his Imperial Majefty has dispatched several persons to the Electors and Princes of the Empire, to take this bufinels into confideration, and to take fuih farther care in it as the neceffi y of Affaires re-

The Bishop of Munsters Agent affures us, that his Mafter intends very suddenly to appear in this Court well at-tended with a large Train, and that he will in person give the Emperor full fatisfaction of his z'al and aff ction to the Empire, and that all the Leavies he has maje are befiles the defence of his own Country, intended for the Spanish fer-

The fourth instant the lower Hungary with the Crostes are to have an Affemby at Presburg ; amongst other bufiness to take order for the payment of the Garrifons in Creatia. The Town of Parkans is by the negligence of the Turks wholly burnt and deftroye. .

'Tis now again discoursed, that the Emperor will in a little time go into Hungary, that Country having f cely offered to entertain feveral R giments upon their own expences for the fervice of the Emperor ; 'is faid their Diet will be held st Odenburg, and that the Emperor will refide for some time at

Neuftat.

There happened lately fo violent a ftorm of Hail in the Turkish Territories, that for fifteen miles compais has ruined and destroyed all their Corn and Vineyards; in so much, that they have commanded, that no Corn fhall be this year carried out of the Country, as has been yearly practied, for fear of a dearth.

Tis confidently reported, that Tranfylvania is now conferred by the G an i S.ignior upon Count Solemmi, who has engaged limitelf tof-cure the Tribute required of tim.

Rome, July 2. His Hillness having dispatche several Courters with Letters written by his own hand to the Enrperous; and the reft of the P.inces his Neighbours, to sequaint them of his Affumption to the Pontifical Chair, and to exhort them to Peace, to which purpole he has elfo difpatched to them his Briefs, according to the u'usi custome; gave order for the Solemn Celebration of he Faneral Oblequies of the lare Pope Alexander, to be three dales iucce's fively performed in the three Patriarchal Cturches of S. Fohn,

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S. Peter, and S. Mary the Great , giving large almes to the poor ; and the more to oblige his Subjects, has also taken off a

part of the Gabels laid upon Corn and Pulfe.
On St. Peters Eye at the Gate of his Palace, he received the Nigg, and the accustomed Tribure for the kingdom of Naples, presented to him by the Marquis de Aftorga, Ambastador from his Catholick Majesty, who was attenued to that Ceremony by the Popes Guards of horse, and a numerous Train of Princes and Noble perfens on horfeback, followed by the Swizze guard, after whom came many Bishops, and then the Ambasisdor himself nobly attended, and sollowed by several rich Coaches. This night and the two following were spent in Luminarles, Bonefires, and all publique figues of rejoycing, for the Election of the Pope, with fireworks and frequent discharges of the great Guns from the Caftle.

Venice, July 8. On Saurday last the Duke of Savey left this City of er a weeks flay, being attended in his return, by many persons of honor, and particularly by the Marquis de St. Germano, the Mester of his borle, and Governor of Torin. During the time of the Dukes stay here, he was lodged in the Pallace of the Count di Lucerna his Ambessador, going by the name of the Count di Sufa, the better to concest himfelf, and take his freedom in diverting himfelf with the view of all the curtofities of this place : before his arrival bere, he went to Cataio, In a vifit to her Highness the Dutchefs of Bavaria, where he ftald feme few cai s, prefenting her, and the young P incels her daugh er with Jewels, to the value of 2000 peices of Eight, giving befides many large pre-feats to the Lad, s, and perfors of quality at ending them: before his going from hance, he took a view of our thipping, especially of the Convoy under the command of Signior Labia, on whole ships be went on board, where he was received with a discharge of all their Gurs, which was answered by the reft of the ships, to his great satisfaction, among st whom
