HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council was this day pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the twelfth day of November next, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-ninth day of December following; and that the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which stand prorogued to Friday the thirteenth day of November next, should be further prorogued to Wednesday the thirtieth day of December following.

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 155, it is enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any private person or persons to import any goods, wares, or merchandise, from any port or place within the limits of the East India Company's charter, except only into such ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland as shall be provided with warehouses, together with wet docks or basins, or such other securities as shall, in the judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, for the time being, or any three or more of them, in Great Bri-

tain and Ireland respectively, be fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon, and shall have been duly declared so to be, by the Order of His Majesty in Council, in Great Britain, or by the Order of the Lord Lieutenant in Council, in Ireland: And whereas the port of Leith has been deemed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in Great Britain to be fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the port of Leith is a port fit and proper for the deposit and safe custody of all such goods, wares, and merchandise, as well as for the collection of all duties payable thereon:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's reign, intitled "An Act for the more effectual regulation

“ of pilots, and of the pilotage of ships and vessels on the coast of England,” it is, amongst other things, enacted, that a proper and sufficient number of pilots of the Cinque Ports, not less than eighteen at any one time, and in succession from time to time without intermission or any unnecessary delay, shall at all seasonable times, by day and night, constantly ply at sea, or be afloat between the South Foreland and Dungeness, to take charge of all ships and vessels coming from the westward :

And whereas by another Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act to amend an Act, made in the last session of Parliament, intituled An Act for the more effectual regulation of pilots, and of the pilotage of ships and vessels on the coast of England, and for the regulation of boatmen employed in supplying vessels with pilots, licensed under the said Act, so far as relates to the coast of Kent, within the limits of the Cinque Ports,” after reciting, amongst other things, the said Act, passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's reign, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by any Order or Orders made for that purpose, and published by Proclamation in the Gazette, to suspend so much of the said therein-recited Act as directs the Cinque Port pilots constantly to ply at sea and be afloat between the distances in the said therein-recited Act specified, either for any period His Majesty shall think proper, and to be in such case specified in such Order or Orders and Proclamation, or until any further Order of His Majesty in Council shall be issued for again carrying the said provision of the said therein-recited Act into effect and execution, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures, in relation to such specified number of pilots constantly plying at sea, and clauses and regulations for enforcing the same, shall, upon the issuing of such Proclamation, remain and continue so suspended :

And whereas His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, has deemed it expedient to suspend the carrying into execution the said part of the said first recited Act, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, to order,

and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said first recited Act, as directs the Cinque Port pilots constantly to ply at sea and be afloat between the distances in the said first recited Act specified, shall be suspended, and the same is hereby suspended, until further Order of His Majesty in Council shall be issued for again carrying the said provision of the said first recited Act into effect and execution.

G.), Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the Court of Tuscany, Colonel in the Army, Aid-de-Camp to the Prince Regent, Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, and of the Royal Sicilian Order of Saint Ferdinand and of Merit, and Knight of the Imperial Austrian Military Order of Maria Theresa, His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Knight Grand Cross of the Tuscan Order of Saint Joseph, which His Imperial and Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Tuscany has conferred upon His Lordship, in testimony of His Imperial and Royal Highness's approbation of the military services rendered by him against the enemy in the field, during the Neapolitan campaign, and throughout the period in which the troops of His Imperial and Royal Highness were engaged in active operations with the Allied Army in Italy :

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea

Officers, from the 1st July to the 30th September 1818, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 9th, 10th, and 11th of November, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 12th, 13th, 16th, 17th, and 18th of November, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 19th and 20th of November, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attornies.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in Lon-

“don, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, “signifying such his desire;” notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 30th September 1818, will commence paying on the 9th November; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
