

Whitehall, December 7, 1818.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that a stack of oats belonging to Mr. Thomas Hobson, of the Parish of Great Glenn, in the county of Leicester, was maliciously set on fire by some evil disposed person or persons, on the evening of Thursday the 3d instant, at a field barn in the said parish;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set the said oat stack on fire), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
