**T**HE Court of Directors of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, do hereby give notice,

That the special General Court of the said Company, appointed to be held at their House, in Leadenhall-Street, on Wednesday the 21st instant, is made further special, for the purpose of laying before the Proprietors for their approbation, a resolution of the Court of Directors of the 17th ultimo, granting to Captain Sir Murray Maxwell, who commanded His Majesty's late ship *Alceste*, the sum of £1500, under the circumstances therein stated.

The report required by the bye-law now lies at this House for the perusal of the Proprietors.

The said Court is further made special, for the purpose of laying before the Proprietors for their approbation, in conformity with the 17th section of the 6th chapter of the bye-laws, a resolution of the Court of Directors, for the appointment of a Chaplain to the Company's Factory at Canton, with a salary of £800 per annum, payable out of the Commission.

**T**HE Court of Directors of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, do hereby give notice,

That at the General Court of the said Company, appointed to be held at their House, in Leadenhall-Street, on Wednesday the 21st instant, there will be submitted for confirmation, the resolutions of the General Court of the 24th ultimo, approving the grant of £4000 per annum out of the general fee fund, and £600 per annum out of the Company's cash, in aid of a fund for the benefit of the widows and families of deceased officers upon the regular Home Establishment; the grant of £500 per annum out of the general fee fund, and £500 per annum out of the Company's cash, in aid of a fund for the benefit of the widows and families of deceased Elders, Extra Clerks, and others of the Home Service; and the grant to Lieutenant-Colonel James Salmond, the Military Secretary for conducting the military correspondence with India, of an addition of £500 per annum to his salary.

Payment of Prizes, Third Lottery 1818.

**T**HE Commissioners appointed for managing the Lotteries do hereby give notice, that numbers of tickets and shares thereof in all preceding lotteries may be examined at this Office every day, between the hours of ten and three, with their registers of benefits and blanks.

And the Commissioners appointed to take in the benefit tickets of the third lottery 1818, do hereby give notice, that they will attend at their Office in Somerset-Place, on Monday the 3d day of May next, from ten o'clock in the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon, to take in and enter the benefit tickets of the said lotteries, to be exchanged for certificates, pursuant to the Act of Parliament in that behalf.

And for better dispatch thereof, the said Commissioners will take in and enter the benefit tickets from No. 1 to No. 5000, at one seat, and the benefit tickets from No. 5001 to No. 10,000, at another seat; and the persons possessed thereof are directed to bring with their tickets separate lists thereof, marked A and B, formed in numerical order, and adapted to each of the said seats, and at the bottom of each of the said lists to write the name and proper addition of the person entitled to the value of the said tickets.

And the said Commissioners also give further notice, that certificates for the value of the said tickets will be delivered out on Friday the 7th day of May next, at twelve of the clock at noon; after which the said Commissioners will take in and enter tickets in their usual monthly entry; and all persons are desired to observe, they must bring duplicates of their lists when they come for their certificates.

The Commissioners also give further notice, that tickets brought to this Office for payment, the checks of which are torn or destroyed, will not be entered
