with Disbanding the Troops they lately raifed. Cologne, Aug. 14. The Magiltrates of Liege have written a very respectful and submissive Letter to his Electoral Highnels, who was at first very well pleafed with it, and would have returned an An-fwer to it; but understanding afterwards that the Commons had publickly declared their diflike of what their Burgermatters had done, as well with relation to the faid Letter, as the Powers and Infiructions they had refolved to give the Deputies they were fending hither, his Electoral Highness changed his intention, and will, not make any Anfwer to the faid Letter till they are better agreed among themfelves; and in the mean time his Ele-Goral Highness has declared Prince William of Furstadtholder or Governor, under his Electoral Highness, of the Country of Liege. From Strasburg they write, That the French are going to separate the Camps they have in Alface, and that they will begin with that at Landaw. And from Vienna we have an account, that the Rebels in Hungary did very vigoroully attack the City of Cafebaw, but that the Governor hoped, not only to defend it, but likewife to recover the Cittadel; and that the Imperial Troops which had had their Quarters in Tirol, were on their march towards Augsburg.

Hague, Aug. 22. The French Ambassador gave in a Memorial, two days finco, to the States, wherein he endeavours to make good his Pretention concerning the manner of his reception at his Audience, and vefterday he had a Conference with the Deputies of forreign Affairs thereupon; but it feems the matter is not yet adjusted, for we do not hear that any time is appointed for the laid Audience. In the mean time his Excellency caules great Preparations to be made of Fire-works, Uç. againft Tuesday next, when he will give a great Entertainment on the occasion of the Birth of the young Duke of Burgundy. From Berlin we have advice, That the Elector of Brandenburg is fending Chancclor Brandt for Sweden, to endeavour to perfwade that King to come into the Alliance concluded between his Electoral Highnels and the King of Denmark.

Paris, Aug. 22. The 18th and 19th Inflant the Ambaffadors, and other Forreign Misiliers reliding at this Court, had their Audiences of their Majeflies, the Dauphin, the Duke of Burgundy, a d the Duke and Dutchefs of Orleans, to perform their Compliments upon the. Birth of that young Prince. It is faid that on the 1sth of the next Month the King intends to go to Nostre Dame de Chartres, to acquit himfelf of his Vow upon the Birth of his Grandfon; That from thence he will go to Chambor, and after wards to Fontainbleau. Monficur de Louvoy is, as we are informed, preparing for a Journey to Alface, and from thence it's faid he will pais through the Franche-Compte for Italy. We cannot yet certainly learn what Progress the Cardinal d'Effree has made in his Negotiation at Rome : It is faid h : nicets with great difficulties, and that on the 26th paft he had an Audience of the Pope, which lafted many hours. The Duke of Savoy, we hear, continues verv ill.

Falmouth, Aug. 10. The eighth Inflant cam: in here the Exeter of London, William Shaw Mafter, from the Weff-Indies, and the Providence of Scarborough, bound with feveral Passengers for Pensilvania.

Plimouth, Aug. 11. His Majeffies Ships the Woolwich, the Centurion, and the Lork are ftill here, with the Merchant Ships under their Convoy. Some of the Fleet attempted to Sail yefferday morning, but the Wind proving contrary, they returned the fame day.

Deale, Aug. 13. Yellerday about Noon paffed by to the Eaflward of the Goodwin about 50 Sail of Dutch Merchant Ships, bound for the Streights; and this Afternoon about 30 of them came into the Downs, being forced thereunto by the contrary Winds.

Whitehal, Ang. 17, 'Yeflerday about feven a Clock in the Morning her Royal Highness, was fafely delivered of a Daughter, at St. Fames's, and about Noon his Royal Highness, having received the News of it, cameto Town from Windfor.

This Morning His Majefty came likewile to Town, to vifit her Royal Highnets, who, Thanks be to God, is in a very good flate of Health. and after Dinnet His Majefty recurned again to windor.

This Afternoon the young Princels was curiffened by the Lord Bilhop of London, by the Plames of Charlotte, Mary, his Grace the Duke of Ormond being Godfather, and the Countels of Arundel, and the Countels of Clarendon, being Godmothers.
