HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, has been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint Thomas Gregory, Esq. to be His Majesty's Judge, and Edward FitzGerald, Esq. to be His Majesty's Arbitrator, and Daniel Molloy Hamilton, Esq. to be Registrar to the mixed English and Netherland Commission to be established at Sierra Leone, under the Treaty between His Majesty and the King of the Netherlands, for preventing the traffic in Slaves, which was signed at the Hague on the 4th of May 1818, and pursuant to the Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His present Majesty, cap. 16, for carrying that Treaty into execution.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, has also been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint Christopher Edward Lefroy, Esq. to be His Majesty's Judge, and Thomas Sherard Wale, Esq. to be His Majesty's Arbitrator to the mixed English and Netherland Commission to be established at Surinam, under and pursuant to the Treaty and Act of Parliament above mentioned.
