**W**Hereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that divers outrages and depredations have been committed at Westbury, in the county of Salop, particularly on the property of Richard Topp, Esq; and that on the night of Thursday the 11th of March last, or early on the following morning, some evil-disposed person or persons did enter a cow-shed belonging to Mr. George Geary, agent to the said Richard Topp, and maliciously kill one cow, and dangerously maim another;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felonies above particularized, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually committed the same), who shall discover his, her, or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **SIDMOUTH.**

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of **ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS** is hereby offered by the said George Geary, to any person (except as before excepted) who shall discover the person or persons concerned in the felonies above particularized, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.
