THE ceremony of the Baptism of Princess Alexandrina Victoria, daughter of His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent, and of Her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Kent, Dutchess of Saxe Cobourg Snalfeld, his wife, was performed this day privately at Kensington-Palace, by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, in the presence of Mis Royal Highness the Prince Regent; their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Dutchess of York; the Princess Augusta; the Duke and Dutchess of Gloucester; the Princess Sophia Matilda; the Prince Leapeld of Saxe Cobourg; Her Serene Highness the Princess Feodore of Leiningen; the Lord Bishop of London; Major-General the Right Hanourable Sir Benjamia Bloomfield, K.C.B; and the suite of the respective royal personages above named.

The Sponsors for the young Princess were His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, who was graciously pleased to stand in person; His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russsia, represented by His Royal Highness the Duke of York; Her Majesty the Queen Dowager of Wirtemberg, represented by Her Royal Highness the Princess Augusta; and Her Serene Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Saxe Cobourg Saalfeld, represented by Her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Gloucester.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftysixth year of His Majosty's reign, cap. 36, intituled " An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majerty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no vallet or enrolment for the local militia shall take place; but that each builds and caralment shall remain and openious suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding; and whereas by no Order in Council, made the fifth of June one thousand eight hundred and eightoen, it was ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of his Majesty's Prive Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place for the space of one year from the twenty-seventh of June last, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the said twenty-seventh of June last: and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of this instant June; it is therefore ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or entolment for the local militia do take place for the

space of one year from and after the wentyseventh day of this instant June, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia do remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from and after the said twenty-seventh day of this Jas. Buller instant June. gena de
