Kensington-Palace, June 24, 1819.

THE ceremony of the Baptism of Princess Alexandrina Victoria, daughter of His Royal Highness the Duke of Kent, and of Her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Kent, Dutchess of Saxe Cobourg Saalfeld, his wife, was performed this day privately at Kensington-Palace, by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, in the presence of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Dutchess of York; the Princess Augusta; the Duke and Dutchess of Gloucester; the Princess Sophia Matilda; the Prince Leopold of Saxe Cobourg; Her Serene Highness the Princess Feodore of Leiningen; the Lord Bishop of London; Major-General the Right Honourable Sir Benjamin Bloomfield, K. C. B; and the suite of the respective royal personages above named.

The Sponsors for the young Princess were His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, who was graciously pleased to stand in person; His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russia, represented by His Royal Highness the Duke of York; Her Majesty the Queen Dowager of Wirtemberg, represented by Her Royal Highness the Princess Augusta; and Her Serene Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Saxe Cobourg Saalfeld, represented by Her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Gloucester.

AT the Court at Carlton-House, the 19th of June 1819,

PRESENT.

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 38, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall take place; but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas by an Order in Council, made the fifth of June one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, it was ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place for the space of one year from the twenty-seventh of June last, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the said twenty-seventh of June last: and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of this instant June; it is therefore ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do take place for the

space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of this instant June, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia do remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from and after the said twenty-seventh day of this instant June.

An Act to authorise the receipt and appropriation of certain sums, voluntarily contributed by the Most Noble John Jeffreys Marquess Camden, in aid of the public service.

An Act to amend an Act passed in the fifty-seventh year of His present Majesty, for the more effectual punishment of murders, manslaughter, rapes, robberies, and burglaries, committed in places not within His Majesty's dominions, as relates to the trial of murders, manslaughter, rapes, robberies, and burglaries, committed in Honduras.

An Act for giving further powers to the Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundel navigation, and to the Company of Proprietors of the Wey and Arun Junction Canal, and to confirm an agreement entered into between the said Companies.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the canal navigation from Leeds to Liverpool, to make a navigable cut, and also a collateral branch or railway, from their said canal at Hennis-Bridge, near Wigan, to join the Duke of Bridgewater's canal at Leight, all in the county-palatine of Lancaster; and to amend the several Acts relating to the said Leeds and Liverpool canal, and an Act for making the Rochdale canal, so far as relates to certain powers therein given to the late Duke of Bridgewater.

An Act to explain and amend an Act of the forty-ninth year of His present Majesty, for repealing an Act of the twenty-fifth year of His present Majesty for the improvement of the river Wear, and port and haven of Sunderland, in the county-palatine of Durham; and for the more effectual preservation and further improvement of the same river, port, and haven.

An Act to establish a Company for lighting the borough of Newcastle-under-Lyme with gas.

An Act to repeal part of an Act made in the fifty-first year of His present Majesty for paving, lighting, and watching the streets, and otherwise regulating the police, of the town of Dumfries.

An Act for more effectually improving and repairing the road leading from the city of Dublin to Navan, in the county of Meath.

An Act for making and maintaining certain turnpike-roads within the county of Dumfries, and the other highways, bridges, and ferries therein, and for more effectually converting into money the statute labour in the said county.

SHIPPING ORDERS AND REGULATIONS.
For the preservation of His Majesty's Mooring, and for the Mooring, Anchoring, and placing of all His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and all other private and Merchant Ships and Vessels, Lighters, Barges, Boats, and other Craft whatsoever, in the Harbour of Haventock Millford, in the County of Pembroke, for the purpose of insuring free and safe ingress, egress, and regress, unto, from, and from His Majesty's Docks, Dock Yard, Arsenals, Wharfs, and Moorings therein, pursuant to an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty King George the Third, and intitled "An Act for the better regulation of the several Ports, Harbours, Roads, and Navigable Rivers, in Great Britain, and in His Majesty's Docks, Dock Yards, Arsenals, Wharfs, Mooring, and Stores therein, and for repealing several Acts passed for that purpose."

It is hereby ordered, that no owner, master, or other commanding officer, of any private ship of war, transport, or other private or merchant ship or vessel, lighter, barge, boat, or other craft, nor any pilot or other person employed by either of them, shall anchor or moor, or cause to be anchored or moored, any such private ship or vessel, transport, or other private ship or vessel, lighter, barge, boat, or other craft, in the fair way or channel between the King's moorings in the said harbour, within fifty fathoms of the centers of any of the said moorings, or of His Majesty's ships, floating magazines, and hulks lying thereat, or in the front or abreast of His Majesty's dock yard, or even to drop an anchor within such space and situations, except in case of necessity, to prevent damage to herself, or that of the King's ships, which may be at the contiguous mooring, and then to remove as soon as possible thereafter, except also in cases where any of the said ships, vessels, or craft, may be consigned to the dock yard, and must, therefore, necessarily anchor contiguous thereto, till they can come to the cranes and wharfs for delivery of their cargoes, and then to be placed in such situations as His Majesty's Officers, or

King's Pilots by whom they are conducted, shall direct, not 0013, but 2222 2222 2222 2222.

Nor shall any private ship or vessel, lighter, barge, boat, or other craft, be made fast to, or be moored or secured by any of the mooring anchors, or chains to which access can be had when the tide is out, or be made fast to any of the buoys or piles of His Majesty within the said harbour, in the front of the said dock yard, or other premises belonging to it, nor anchor or moor, so as to swing within any of the said buoys or piles, upon pain of the penalties for such offences, and all other prohibitions and restrictions, herein contained as the said Act of Parliament directs.
