PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT** in Council,

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 38, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall take place; but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas by an Order in Council, made the fifth of June one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, it was ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place for the space of one year from the twenty-seventh of June last, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the said twenty-seventh of June last: and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of this instant June; it is therefore ordered by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do take place for the space of one year from and after the twenty-seventh day of this instant June, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia do remain

and continue suspended for the space of one year from and after the said twenty-seventh day of this instant June.

His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT** in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the thirty-first of October last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunpowder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant May; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth of this instant May), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa, or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His

Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt-petre, and to enforce the law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gunpowder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:"

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

An Act for raising a loan of twelve millions from the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt.

An Act to grant to His Majesty an additional duty of excise on tobacco in Ireland.

An Act to repeal several Acts requiring the masters of vessels carrying certificate goods to Ireland to take duplicates of the contents; prohibiting the importation of certain wrought goods, and the exportation of gunpowder when the price shall exceed a certain sum.

An Act to allow the importation of tobacco from the East Indies and other places, and for confining the exportation of tobacco from Great Britain, and the importation thereof into Ireland to vessels of seventy tons burthen and upwards.

An Act to continue until the fifth day of July

one thousand eight hundred and twenty, two Acts, made in the fifty-fourth and fifty-sixth years of His present Majesty, for regulating the trade in spirits between Great Britain and Ireland reciprocally.

An Act to establish further regulations respecting advances by the Bank of England for the public service, and the purchase of Government securities by the said Bank.

An Act to continue, until the twenty-fourth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, an Act for amending the laws relating to the allowance of the bounties on Pilchards exported.

An Act to amend an Act, made in the fifty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign, for enabling the Commissioners of Customs and Port Duties in Ireland to purchase premises for erecting docks, warehouses, and offices, in Dublin.

An Act for transferring the duty of the Supervisor of the Receiver-General's receipts and payments to the Comptroller-General of the Customs in England.

An Act to continue, until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty, two Acts of the forty-fifth and fiftieth years of His present Majesty allowing the bringing of coals, culm, and cinders, to London and Westminster, by inland navigation.

An Act concerning common recoveries to be suffered by attorney in Courts of Antient Demesne, and to explain an Act of His present Majesty relative to the sale or mortgaging of estates of lunatics.

An Act to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament for appointing Commissioners to enquire concerning charities in England for the education of the poor, and to extend the powers thereof to other charities in England and Wales, to continue in force until the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and from thence until the end of the then next session of Parliament.

An Act to rebuild Windsor Bridge, in the borough of New Windsor, in the county of Berks, and to improve the avenues thereto.
