Cologne, Sept. 1. The Sieur Hanius, Deputy of Liege, who has hithere's continued here, having on Sa u Jay falt received an Order from his Principals to redurn forthwith hor e to inform the other D-puties, which the City of finge has re olved to fend hither in hisplace, of the prefent flate of affairs at the Court of his Electoral Highness, their Prince, he intends to part from hence to morrow; but feeing his Electoral Highners perfilts in his refolution not 18 receive any Deputies from the faid City, unless they are fully employered to Treat and Con-elude as he shall think fit, and that on the other side the Magilitates as well as the Common's of Liege will not give their D pulies to great a Power, there is very little appearance of these D-puties coming fuddenly hith r, and the hopes people had that things were fairly tending to an actommoda-tion, begin to varilh. The Secretary to Count Mansfeldt, the Emperors Envoy Extraottibury at the Court of France, patted through this place yefterday with his Malters Baggage, and reported that the Count himfelf will follow in few days. Prom Metz we have advice, That the 26th pair two Ba-talions of the French Kings Regiment of Guards. arrived there.

Frankfort, Sept. 6. The Difficulties that have put a ltop to the me ting of the Deputies of the Emp pire, are not yet removed, to that here pairs nothing of momene. From Vienna they write, That the Emperor had ordered all his Foices to March from Bohemia, Silefia, Croatia, and other His Heredi ary Countreys, towards Jungary, to make head against the Rebels, who with the affiltances they have from the Turks, are become very powerful; and are in a condition to attack any place.
