

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause wherein Thomas Maltby and others are the plaintiffs, and Joshua Russell and others are the defendants, the Creditors of John Russell, late of Maidstone, in the County of Kent, Gentleman (who died on the 21st of March 1815), are to come in and prove their debts before Francis Paul Stratford, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, on or before the 22d day of January 1820, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
