## Fletence, Sept. 26.

SEveral Souldiers and Officers of the Italian Regiment, which has been lately Disban ded in France, are arrived at Leghorn, and other Places! The Duke of Savoy continues under his Indifpofition; and the Duke of Cadaval is preparing to recurn to Lisbon with the Fleet, Three Slaves having made their efcape from zargiers, if a fmalt open Boal, having no Sajl, and only two Oars, are arríved at Legborne, àfter having been 23 Days at Sea, and threc Days without any Provifions.

Itemm, ofiob, 4. Oür Letters from the Camp of General Caprara, of the 27 th palt, give an account, That the Imperial Army was fo coufide rably reinforced, that it was in a condition to march towards the Enemy, but that they wanted Wagons to carry Provifions, and other neceffaries, the Country People who were coming in with them, having been forced to return home, becaute of the diforders committed by the Militia raifed by the Palatine of Hungary, who live without any Order or Difcipline; That for this reafon Gencral Caprara was obliged to continue in his Camp between Trendbin and Ledpo'Radt, on the Warg. Levies are making in all the Emperor's Hereditary Countreys, to recruit the old Bodies that are on Foor, and it's faid Commifions will in few days be given out for the raifing of feveral new Regiments, Th: lıte Governor of Cafchaw is dead; his accufation wa, That that plaee was lof by his feglect, from whence to many if acçidents have fince refulted. Juft now arrive Letters from General Caprare of the firf Inllant, which fay, That Lieutenant-Colonel, Heylter, being abroad with tooo Imperial, Horfe and Dragoons, had furpirized 1000 Foot and 200 Horfe of the Rebels, had killed 300 of them upon the place, and had tàken 45 Prifoners, and 13 Colours; That this Prifoners repported that Count Teckeley had refolved to abandon Atjot, Newfol, Cbremnitz, and prljer places in the Mountains? and that the Turks and the Rebels were not leparated, as had been reported, but that the yizier of Buda had, by reaion of hisillneís, left the Army under a good Convoy, which had occalfoned that rèport.
Francfort, $\sigma$ diob. 6., On the i8th paft the French Ambalfadors here prefented a Memorial to the Imperial Ambafladors, and to the Deputics of the Empire, in which they declare, in the name of the King their Matter, That his Majelty id willing to fland to the Offers which he has made by his Minifters for determining amidably his jutt Rights and Preténtions, till the faft day of November; ; Dut in cafe the faid Offers are mot accepted before that time, his Majefty will be at liberty to purfue his gwn fatisfattion in fuch manner as he thall think fit: and the $f$ urth Inilant the French Ambalfad.ors gavt in another Memorial, by which they declare, That if the Offers made by the Kingthe ir Matter be not accepted beforé the layd day of the
next Month, they fhall be obliged to leave this place, after having, for the ipace of a Year that thes have been here, done all that lay in them for the eflablifhugg a good Inielligence between his Majelly änd the Empire. ?..

The Marquifs de 'Coursenvaux, ${ }^{\text {, }}$ Son to Monlicue de Louvog, parted from hence the fecoad Inftant for Mentr, and the fame day arrived here the Baron de Monctar, the French King's Lieutenant-General in Alface, but made no ftar here. Eolognir, OEFOb. 9. Oì Friday laft it was knowng that our Elector bad refolyed to admit of the Deputation, which the City of Liege will fend hithar, upon condition that the faid Depul ies come not only from the Magiftrates, but from the Reopl. that fo the Commonalty may not difapprove of what they hall do. And the fame day his Eles ctoral Higunefs font to the sieur fodocis the Im: peri:a Minifter, to acquaint him, witht the Refolution he had taken, and to defire, him to give notige of it to the Magiltates at Lieg?, Whe Syndic of this City, which our Magiftrates fent to the Dircctors of the Circle of weffpbalia, is come back and $_{\wedge}$ and has given che Magiffrates an account, That the $\bar{\varphi}-\frac{1}{4}$ rectors of tha faid Circle $x_{x}$, have promifed to bave 1000 Men ready for the Service of this City and thait they will caufe them to March hither whenever our Magiftrates thall defire it We;de not yet dertainly hedic when the Bihop, of swasburg will be here.
