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Stockholme, Sept. 27.

WE are expecting here the *Sieur Brands*, with the Character of *Envoy Extraordinary* from the *Electour of Brandenburg*; many are impatient till he arrives, because of their great curiosity to know what he comes to propose in this conjuncture of Affairs. The *Courier* which the *Sieur Bafin*, the *French Ambassador* sent to *France*, on occasion of the dispute about the Ceremonies of his publick Reception and Audience, is come back, so that we shall now quickly know what Orders he has received in this matter; but in the mean time we are assured that this Court will not depart from the form and methods which have been always practised here in like cases. The 14th Instant arrived here an *Ambassador* from *Moscovy*; he and all his Attendants are in close Mourning; he has not yet had his Audience of the King, so that we know not the business he comes about, but imagine it to be only a Compliment upon the Death of the late *Czar*, and the accession of the *Czars*, that now Reign, to the Crown.

Turin, Octob. 3. The Duke of *Savoy* is so well recovered that he begins to appear publickly, which fills this Court and Country with an universal Joy. The Duke of *Cadaval*, pursuant to the Orders he has received from the *Prince-Regent of Portugal*, will part from hence in few days: The Duke has presented him with his Picture set with Diamonds, to the value of 1500 Pistols, and the Dutchess has given him a Ring worth 1000 Pistols. The Duke has likewise made the *Envoy of Portugal* a Present of 500 Pistols, and has given 800 Pistols to the *Admiral of the Fleet*, 400 to the *Vice-Admiral*, 250 to each of the Officers that were to have attended his Highness, 60 to every *Voluntier*, and 10000 Pistols to be distributed among the Officers and Seamen of the Fleet.

Vienna, Octob. 8. Our Letters from *Hungary* inform us, That the *Turks* and *Transilvanians* were retired, having only left a Body of 10000 Men with *Count Teckelej*, who seems at present very desirous of a Cessation of Arms, and had sent to *General Caprara* to propose one, but it's said that *General* answered, That when he had finish'd his Campaign, as *Count Teckelej* had done, a Proposition like this would be more seasonable, however directed him to make his application to the *Emperor*. Their *Imperial Majesties* have been here to take their leaves of the Duke and Dutchess of *Neubourg*, who are returned home, as likewise of the Duke of *Lorrain*, and the *Queen Dowager of Poland*, who are going back to *Tyrol*, and this day their Majesties returned to *Ebersdorf*, where they will continue till the 14th or 15th of this Month. The Moneys which *Count Teckelej* has caused to be Coined has on one side a Hand with a naked Sable in it, with this Inscription, *Pro Deo*

& *Pavia*, and on the other side his Effigies, with these words, *Emericus Comes Teckelej, Dux Hungarorum*. The *Rebels* have attacked a small place belonging to *Count Palfi*, in which were 150 Men, who have quitted the Town, and are retired into the Castle, which they still defend.

Vienna, Octob. 11. To morrow the *Duke of Lorraine* and his Wife, the *Queen Dowager of Poland*, part from hence for *Tyrol*. Two days since arrived here an *Envoy* from *Moscovy*, with a Train of about 20 Persons. Yesterday were sent from hence for *Hungary* 40 Brass Boats, for the use of the *Imperial Army* in the Passage of Rivers. Yesterday we received Letters from the Camp of *General Caprara*, Dated the eighth Instant, which give an account, That the Army continued Encamped within three Miles of *Trenchin* on the *Waag*, and that *General Caprara* intended to march the next day towards the *Rebels*, who were Posted near the *Berg-Towns*; That *Count Teckelej* had sent a Detachment to *Lewents*, and that upon their approach, the *Horse* in *Garison* there, who were all *Hungarians*, had revolted, so that it was feared that place would fall into the *Enemies* hands; That the *Turks* were encamped near *Agria*, and that the *Transilvanians* lay likewise Encamped in a Body by themselves. Here is arrived an Express, sent by *Count Teckelej*, with Letters desiring a Cessation of Arms in order to a Treaty. The *Militia of Hungary*, commanded by the *Palatine* of that Kingdom, continue to commit great disorders.

Frankfort, Octob. 15. The *Deputies* of the *Empire*, after having had several meetings upon the late Declaration of the *French Ambassadors*, did the 13th Instant resolve, That the *Deputies of Metz*, as *Directors* of their Assembly, should represent to the *Statos* of the *Empire* assembled at *Ratisbonne*; That the *Deputies* at the Conference held here, not being sufficiently instructed to return an Answer to the Declaration made by the *French Ambassadors*, they had thought fit, that no time might be lost, to communicate the same to the *Dyets*, that they may return a speedy Answer therunto: And the next Morning an Express was sent from hence to *Ratisbonne*, with this Dispatch. From *Witsburg*, where *Prince Waldeck* now is, they write; That the *Circle of Franconia* have resolved to increase their Forces; that they may be in a condition to make good their late Alliance with the *Emperor*.

Brussels, Octob. 20. The *French Troops* in the new Conquests, both *Horse* and *Foot*, are marching towards *Luxemburg*, and at *Metz* and *Thionville* the *French* are providing Cannon and other necessaries for a Siege. The *Sieur de Prado*, and the *Sieur d'Acfferden*, late Secretaries to the *Prince of Parma*, have both obtained their Liberty, but on this condition, That the *Sieur Prado* is to continue in this place, and the *Sieur Acfferden* is to remain in the Cloister, out of which he was taken, till farther Order.
