Monficur du Quesne, upon his arrival at Thoufour found Orders there to go over for Tripoli, with three on four Men of War, to confirm the Peace with that Government, and to redeem the French Slaves that are there, and from thence he is to go for Tunis with the same Commission. The ten French Galleys that were defigned for Villa-France have been at Sea, but were forced back again the fame day by the violence of the Weather, and fince their geturn, Orders are come from Course to retain them here till the arrival of the Duke-de Mortemar, (who was a Voluntier on Board Monfieur du Quefue in this Expedition againit Argiens) he being to command these Galleys in the place of Monstevn de Nouvailles.
