POST HORSE DUTIES.

Each district will be put up at the sum above set opposite thereto. The highest bidder will be declared the farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank notes, seven and a half per cent. upon the annual rent as a deposit; if no sufficient bidding shall be made for any district, it will be withdrawn.

The farmer of each district will be required to give bond, with three or more sureties, to be approved of by the Commissioners of Stamps, in the penalty of half the annual rent, for securing the payment of the rent and the performance of his contract.
