THE following Address having been transmitted to Viscount Sidmouth, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by the Town Clerk of the City of New Sarum, has been presented by His Lordship to the King, and most graciously received:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Mayor and Commonalty of the City of New Sarum, in Common Council assembled, humbly present to your Majesty this solemn declaration of our unchangeable attachment to your Majesty's Royal Person and Government, and to our invaluable Constitution.

Though the clamour of disaffection may seem to prevail, and misguided persons may impeach the integrity of the Constituted Authorities, yet we venture to assure your Majesty that, in this reflecting country, the triumph of truth is eventually certain, and that the loyal and the good will unite with one heart in dutiful fidelity to the laws, and in undaunted resolution to maintain, in every emergency, our happy establishment in Church and State.

We doubt not that, protected by Providence, your Majesty's royal power, founded in wisdom and anxiously administered for the public good, guarded by the affections of all virtuous men, and supported by all who value the peace, the prosperity, and the glory of their country, will remain unshaken in the storms of conspiracy and the wildest uproar of sedition.

That your Majesty may long reign over us the Guardian of our venerated Laws, the Protector of our antient Liberties, and the beloved Sovereign of a great and loyal nation is our constant prayer.

Given under our common seal the 15th day of November in the year of our Lord 1820.

POST HORSE DUTIES.

Each district will be put up at the sum above set opposite thereto. The highest bidder will be declared the farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank notes, seven and a half per cent. upon the annual rent as a deposit, if no sufficient bidding shall be made for any district, it will be withdrawn.

The farmer of each district will be required to give bond, with three or more sureties, to be

approved of by the Commissioners of Stamps, in the penalty of half the annual rent, for securing the payment of the rent and the performance of his contract.

And it is intended, that the districts shall be put up in any order which the Commissioners of Stamps may think fit, and which will not be declared before the time of letting.

All persons intending to bid for any of the said duties, are to deliver in their proposals, addressed to the Commissioners at the Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, at least three days previous to the said 24th day of November next, signed with their names, stating the places of their abode, and specifying the district or districts for which they intend to bid, otherwise their proposals cannot be proceeded upon.

And no persons licensed to let horses for the purpose of travelling post, nor any one for their use, can be admitted to contract for any of the said duties.
