THE following Address having been transmitted to Viscount Sidmouth, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by the Marquess of Anglesey, K. G. and the Earl of Uxbridge, Member of Parliament for the county of Anglesey, has been presented by His Lordship to the King, and most graciously received:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's ever dutiful and loyal subjects, the Gentlemen, Clergy, and Freeholders of the County of Anglesey, beg leave to approach your Majesty with the sincerest expression of attachment to your Royal Person.

That determined spirit of loyalty which in former ages animated the breasts of the Ancient Britons, and which we inherit, convinces us, that the happiness we in common with this kingdom at large enjoy can only be preserved by a firm and steady support of the Crown.

We view with disgust the exertions made by a vile and intolerant faction, to corrupt the minds of the people by gross misrepresentations, in the hopes of leading the loyal subject from his allegiance, and distracting the minds of the timid.

When these attempts are openly and industriously made by the seditious, we feel it incumbent thus publicly to declare to your Majesty our determination to support to the utmost of our power our present great and glorious Constitution, and thereby shield and defend our Sovereign from insult, our Religion and our Laws from anarchy, and preserve our country from destruction.

POST HORSE DUTIES.

Stamp-Office, London, October 24, 1820.

Each district will be put up at the sum above set opposite thereto. The highest bidder will be declared the farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank notes, seven and a half per cent. upon the annual rent as a deposit; if no sufficient bidding shall be made for any district, it will be withdrawn.

The farmer of each district will be required to give bond, with three or more sureties, to be
