Here is much difculufe of a Defenfive Alliance fately concluded between the King of Denmdrk, the Elector of Brandenburg, and the Bifhop of Munfter, to fecure their Countacysagainit Winter-Qualters for any Troops but their owa; and it's Fid the three Ecclefialtick Electors, and the Elcetor Palatine, will likewife, come into this Alifance, which feems to be male in oppofition to that concladed not long fince between the Emperor and the Circles of Franconia and the Upper Rbine.

Hague, Oltob. 30. The 28 th inftant Tbomus Cbudleigb E'q; Envoy Extraordinary from His Majefty of Great britain to this State, recurned hither from England. The Prince of Orakge is at Sogfidyke, and will, it's believed, continue $t$ iere till the meeting of the States of Holland, which wili be about the middlc of the hext Month. The Deputics of Hol. láni and Zealand have had feveral meetings for the adjufting fome differences that are dep nding be tween the two Provinces.
