

pire, the French Troops will enter into the Countreys of *Aloft Grammont*; and *Nimone*, and others which the most Christian King has Pretensions upon, and that they will again block up the City of *Luxemburg*: And our Letters from *Germany* say, That the French Ambassadors there give out, that in case they receive not a satisfactory Answer from the Imperial Ambassadors, and the Deputies of the Empire, before the 20th of the next Month, they will, on the first of *December*, leave that place, and that immediately after their departure the Decrees of the Sovereign Chambers at *Metz* and *Brisac*, concerning the re-unions, will begin again to be put in execution. Here is much discourse of a Defensive Alliance lately concluded between the King of *Denmark*, the Elector of *Brandenburg*, and the Bishop of *Munster*, to secure their Countreys against Winter-Quarters for any Troops but their own; and it's said the three Ecclesiastick Electors, and the Elector Palatine, will likewise, come into this Alliance, which seems to be made in opposition to that concluded not long since between the Emperor and the Circles of *Franconia* and the Upper *Rhine*.

*Hague, Octob. 30.* The 28th Instant *Thomas Chudleigh* Esq; Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of *Great Britain* to this State, returned hither from *England*. The Prince of *Orange* is at *Soestdyke*, and will, it's believed, continue there till the meeting of the States of *Holland*, which will be about the middle of the next Month. The Deputies of *Holland* and *Zealand* have had several meetings for the adjusting some differences that are depending between the two Provinces.

*Paris, Octob. 31.* We have an account from *Thoulon*, That Monsieur du *Quine* arrived there the 12th Instant, with four Men of War, from *Algiers*, where we hear he did not do the execution with the Bombs he shot into the Town, that was at first reported. The differences between this Court and that of *Rome* seem to be at present as far from an accommodation as ever, and it is said that the Cardinal d' *Estree*, who has had the chief management of things on the behalf of this Court, is on his departure from *Rome* to return hither. The 26th Instant the Ambassador of the Duke of *Savoy* had a private Audience of the King, and we are assured that there are very close measures between our King and the Duke of *Savoy*.

*Glocester, Octob. 9.* The Mayor of this City, having desired the Right Honourable the Lord Marquis of *Worcester*, and the Lord *Herbert*, to do him the honour to Dine with him on this Day, they were pleas'd very readily to accept of the Invitation. His Lordship was received at the Gate of the City, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Common-Council, and the Trained-Bands in Arms, and conducted amidst the Ringing of Bells, and other publick expressions of Respect, to the Mayors House; where his Lordship, with the Lord *Herbert*, and several of the Principal Gentlemen of the County, and divers Citizens of this City, was entertained at a very noble and splendid Dinner.

*London, Octob. 25.* Yesterday the Lord Mayor and Court of Aldermen, were attended by the Sheriffs, the Common-Serjeant, and the Gentlemen who were appointed on both sides to examine the

Roll, and the Common-Serjeant having acquainted his Lordship and the Court, That there were Objections made against several persons, as not qualified, and propos'd the said Objections, he pray'd their Judgment upon them, which after hearing of Counsel, the Court gave; and then the Common-Serjeant acquainted his Lordship, That he should be ready on the morrow to make his Report: Whereupon his Lordship Summoned a Common Hall, which accordingly met this day, and Report being made, That Sir *William Prichard* had 2138 Votes of persons duly qualified, Sir *Thomas Gold* 2124, and Mr. *Cornish* 2093, the Lord Mayor, and Aldermen proceeded, according to custom, to choose one by scrutiny, and the choice fell upon Sir *William Prichard*; which done, the Lord Mayor and Aldermen went down into the Hall, and being sat upon the *Hustings*, the Recorder declared the Election of Sir *William Prichard* to be Lord Mayor for the year ensuing, and the usual ceremonies being performed with great acclamations of Joy and satisfaction, the Hall was dismiss'd.
