**GENERAL ORDERS.**

**I**T being His Majesty's determination that no Officer holding a Commission in His Service (whether on full or half pay) should engage in the service of any of the Powers or Countries which are unfortunately now involved in hostilities, The Commander in Chief has received His Majesty's Commands to caution all Officers who have obtained leave to visit the Continent, or to reside there; all those who may hereafter proceed to the Continent, as well as those who may have previously obtained His Majesty's sanction to serve in any Foreign Army, against engaging or continuing in the employment of the Armies of any of the Contending Parties; and His Royal Highness is further commanded to admonish them, that by disregarding this caution, they will forfeit their Commissions in the British service.
