THE following is a copy of an order from His Majesty to the Marquess of Winchester, Groom of the Stole, which, in obedience to His Majesty's commands, has been communicated by his Lordship to the Lords of His Majesty's Bedchamber:

THE honour of Knighthood having, in two recent instances, been surreptitiously obtained at the Levee, His Majesty, for the purpose of effec-tually guarding against all such disgraceful practices in future, has been pleased to direct, that hence-forth no person shall be presented to His Majesty at the Levee by the Lord in Waiting, to receive the honour of Knighthood, unless His Majesty's pleasure shall have been previously signified, in writing, to the Lord in Waiting, by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.
