A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

THEREAS We have thought fit to order that certain pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called " sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces," each of which should be of the value of twenty shillings, and that each piece should be of the weight of five penny weights three grains and $\frac{2,740}{10,000}$ troy weight of standard gold; and that certain other pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called " half sovereigns or ten shilling pieces," each of which should be of the value of ten shillings, and that each piece last mentioned should be of the weight of two penny weights thirteen grains 6,870 troy weight of standard gold, according to the weights approved of and confirmed by Us in Council, in pursuance of an Act, made in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for " regulating and ascertaining the weights to be " made use of in weighing the gold and silver " coin of this kingdom:" and We have further thought fit to order that every such gold sovereign or twenty shilling piece so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius IIII, " D. G. Britanniar: Rex: F D." and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the Dragon with a sword, having broken his spear in the encounter, and the date of the year, the edge of the piece to be marked with the new invented graining used on the coins of His late Majesty; and that

every such gold half sovereign or ten shilling piece so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius IIII, D. G. Britanniar: " Rex: F. D." and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom, contained in a shield surrounded by the Rose, Thistle, and Shamrock, and having the word "Anno" with the date of the year, and on the edge of the piece the new invented graining used on the coins of His late Majesty: And whereas pieces of gold money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose: We have, therefore, by and with the advise of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, that the said pieces of gold money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall be called " sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces" and " half sovereigns or ten shilling pieces," and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and every of such sovereigns not weighing less than five penny weights two grains and an half, and every of such half sovereigns not weighing less than two penny weights thirteen grains and one-eighth, shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United King. dom of Great Britain and Ireland, every such sovereign as of the value of twenty shillings of lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and every such half sovereign money, in all payments whatsoever.

Given at Our Court at Carlton-House, the fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, in the second year of Our reign.

THE following Addresses of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by George Earl of Morton, Knight of the Most Ancient Order of the Thistle, His Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Viscount Sidmouth, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have been by him presented to the King; which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously;

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Members of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, have received with sentiments of the profoundest respect, the gracious letter with which your Majesty has condescended to honour us on this occasion.

It is peculiarly gratifying to us to learn, that your Majesty, strengthened by experience in your favourable disposition towards this Church, has repeated at this time your fixed resolution to continue to our Ecclesiastical Establishment your royal countenance and support, and to maintain it in all its rights and privileges. Nor is it less a subject of satisfaction to this Assembly, that your Majesty has expressed your confidence, that in the prudence of the measures which we shall adopt, your Majesty will see cause for still further enhancing your royal affection towards our Church; and that you are persuaded, that we will apply ourselves with temper and moderation, to further the good ends for which we are assembled, namely, the advancement of Religion and the service of Almighty God.

Permit us, accordingly, to assure your Majesty, that in this view, agreeably to your Majesty's paternal admonition, we will sedulously endeavour to avoid all unnecessary debates and contentions; and that our deliberations shall be anxiously directed to the wisest and most efficient modes of checking the growth of vice and impiety, of promoting the practice of all Christian duties, and of keeping alive that respect for the ordinances of Religion and those who administer them, together with that deference to the Civil Magistracy, which, founded on the principles of the Gospel, is so essential to the peace and good order of society, and must ever conduce to the happiness and prosperity of your Majesty's dominions. To the diligent and faithful performance of our duty in these respects, your Majesty's most gracious assurance, that our exertions shall never want your fatherly aid and protection, is a most powerful motive in our minds.

It is truly a ground of joy and of gratitude to Divine Providence, that an end has been put to the sacred and civil, so frequently made by unprincipled

as of the value of ten shillings of like lawful | treasonable conspiracies, which in the course of the last year existed in some parts of this island, growing out of a disposition to subvert the happy Constitution of the kingdom as by law established. Your Majesty may rely on all the influence which you are graciously pleased to ascribe to the Ministers of the Church, being exercised in preventing the renewal of similar attempts; and in our inculcating to the utmost of our power, the duty of obedience to the Constituted Authorities of the land.

> The re-appointment of a Commissioner, so eminently qualified by his loyalty, integrity, and zeal for the service of your Majesty, as the Earl of Morton, to represent your Royal Person on this occasion, is highly acceptable to the General Assembly, from the experience we have had of his fitness to discharge this important trust, and from our personal knowledge of his affection for the Church of Scotland.

> The royal donation of £2000, for the propagation of Christian knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, we accept with the warmest gratitude as a pledge of your Majesty's anxiety to promote the extension of pure religion, and we shall apply it with all fidelity to the pious purpose for which it is bestowed.

> We have only to add, that, under God, no exertion shall be wanting on our part to fulfil the hope expressed by your Majesty, that, by our proceeding in the business before us with that charity, brotherly love, and unanimity, which your Majesty has so graciously recommended, we may bring this Meeting of the Representatives of our Church, to as happy a conclusion as that of any former Assembly.

> That Almighty God may bless your Majesty and all the Members of the Royal Family; that He may ever direct and prosper all the measures of your Majesty's Government; and that He may maintain, till the latest ages, the national blessings we enjoy, are the tervent prayers of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and affectionate subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, eagerly embrace this opportunity of approaching the Throne, to renew the assurance of our cordial attachment and unshaken fidelity to your Majesty's Person and Government.

In common with all the well-disposed and loyal part of your Majesty's subjects throughout the realm, we have beheld, with sentiments of the deepest concern and unfeigned abhorrence, the criminal attempts to undermine the religious principles of the people, and to create a spirit of disaffection and hostility to our invaluable institutions,

men, taking advantage of the temporary distresses of the public, and abusing the liberty of the press by the circulation of the most pernicious writings. But we rejoice in the mercy of Providence, that indications every where appear of returning prosperity in the manufactures and commerce of the country; and it affords us no ordinary degree of satisfaction that the restless spirit to which we allude so eager to catch at every passing event as the means of exciting agitation, has already received what, we earnestly hope, will prove an effectual and lasting check.

With reference to this, we are happy again to bear our testimony to the steady faith and unshaken loyalty of the great body of your Majesty's subjects in this part of the United Kingdom; even in districts where the worst symptoms of disaffection and disorder had been manifested, so great is the change which has taken place, that it is with the most heartfelt satisfaction we can now congratulate your Majesty on the evident return in the minds of the people to sounder principle and better feeling, and even a sense of the grievous delusions under which they had laboured; and deploring the infatuation of those who have endeavoured so nefariously to create disrespect for the Constituted Authorities of the land, we solemnly pledge our-selves to your Majesty that we will exert, with zeal and diligence, all the means in our power to counteract the progress of those principles of infidelity and irreligion, which tend to incite to the perpetration of the most atrocious crimes, amidst confusion and every evil work, and which indeed are so intimately connected with disloyalty, insubordination, and licentiousness in all their forms; we will earnestly strive to cherish and maintain, among the people under our pastoral charge, a due spirit of veneration and love for that system of Religion and Government, of whose inestimable advantages we have had so long, not only the personal but the recorded experience, which has been matured by the wisdom of ages, and which challenges the admiration of the world.

We could not fail to contemplate with much interest, those occurrences on the Continent which lately threatened the peace of Europe; it is fortunate for this Island that no intention exists on the part of its Sovereign to interpose in the dissentions of Foreign States, except in cases of urgent necessity; as servants of the Prince of peace, we trust that the same pacific maxims will ever actuate the Executive Councils of the nation.

Remembering with the liveliest sentiments of gratitude the paternal regard to the National Establishment, of which we are members, uniformly evinced by your Majesty's illustrious predecessor, who, during a long and eventful life, approved himself a Patriot King and a true Christian, the father of his people, and the great pillar of the Constitution in Church and State; we feel it truly gratifying to see your Majesty, in the exercise of your high Constitutional functions, following the example of a Sovereign, whose memory will never be recalled without admiration and delight, while the noblest qualities of human nature are esteemed and respected amongst men. Under the Government of a Monarch animated by the same paternal feelings, and ruling by principles so truly laudable

and patriotic as those of your Majesty, we foully anticipate the perpetuity of the honour, the glory, and the prosperity of the British empire; we are inspired with the firmest confidence in the permanant security of our rights and liberties, sacred and civil; we trust in the strength of the Most High that no event will occur to endanger the existence or privileges of that Church which was established by the zeal, energy, and blood of our fathers, and which we hope will, under God, continue to form the consolation and blessing of future generations in this land through many succeeding ages.

That Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Ghrist, may bless your Majesty, direct your councils, and establish your Throne in righteousness and peace; that your Majesty may be the instrument of Divine Providence to maintain inviolate our glorious and happy Constitution of Government; that after a long and prosperous reign over a tree, a loyal, and a happy people, your Ma-jesty may be exalted to a crown that endureth for ever; and that the descendants of your illustrious House, which has so long been the ornament and blessing of these kingdoms, may continue to sway the British sceptre till the latest posterity, are the sincere and fervent prayers of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most loyal, and most obedient subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

OTICE is hereby given to Country Bankers, that the issue of the new stamps on country notes of one and two pounds value, has commenced at this Office.

The following allowances will be granted by the Commissioners of Stamps to Bankers, who are desirous of exchanging their notes, having the old stamps on them, for the new;

1st. On notes that have never been put in circulation the whole of the duty will be allowed, provided they are brought for allowance within twelve calendar months from this date, but this allowance will not commence for the first six months.

2d. On notes that have been in circulation for any period not exceeding one year, two-thirds of the duty, provided they are brought for allowance within two calendar months from the expiration of that time.

3d. On notes that have been in circulation for

any period exceeding one year, but not exceeding two years, one-third of the duty, provided they are brought for allowance within two calendar months from the expiration of that time.
