A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit to order that certain pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called "sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces," each of which should be of the value of twenty shillings, and that each piece should be of the weight of five penny weights three grains and $\frac{2,740}{10,000}$ troy weight of standard gold; and that certain other pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called "half sovereigns or ten shilling pieces," each of which should be of the value of ten shillings, and that each piece last mentioned should be of the weight of two penny weights thirteen grains $\frac{6,370}{10,000}$ troy weight of standard gold, according to the weights approved of and confirmed by Us in Council, in pursuance of an Act, made in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating and ascertaining the weights to be made use of in weighing the gold and silver coin of this kingdom:" and We have further thought fit to order that every such gold sovereign or twenty shilling piece so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius III, D. G. Britanniar: Rex: F. D." and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the Dragon with a sword, having broken his spear in the encounter, and the date of the year, the edge of the piece to be marked with the new invented graining used on the coins of His late Majesty; and that every such gold half sovereign or ten shilling piece so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius III, D. G. Britanniar: Rex: F. D." and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom, contained in a shield surrounded by the Rose, Thistle, and Shamrock, and having the word "Anno" with the date

of the year, and on the edge of the piece the new invented graining used on the coins of His late Majesty: And whereas pieces of gold money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose: We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, that the said pieces of gold money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall be called "sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces" and "half sovereigns or ten shilling pieces," and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and every of such sovereigns not weighing less than five penny weights two grains and an half, and every of such half sovereigns not weighing less than two penny weights thirteen grains and one-eighth, shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, every such sovereign as of the value of twenty shillings of lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and every such half sovereign as of the value of ten shillings of like lawful money, in all payments whatsoever.

Given at Our Court at Carlton-House, the fifth day of May one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, in the second year of Our reign.

GOD save the KING.

AT the Court at Carlton-House, the 5th of May 1821,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the twenty-second of November last, for prohibiting the exportation of gold

powder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant May; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth day of this instant May), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place within the dominions of the King of Spain, or to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar), or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places within the dominions of the King of Spain, or into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent*

to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for removing doubts as to the continuance of the hereditary revenue in Scotland.

An Act to repeal the duties of Customs on the importation into Great Britain of certain sorts of wood and timber, and certain drawbacks or allowances in respect of such duties, and to grant other duties and drawbacks in lieu thereof.

An Act for applying a certain sum of money out of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for the purpose of building a bridge over the River Conway, in the county of Carnarvon; and for imposing additional rates of postage on letters and packets conveyed over the said bridge.

An Act to defray the charge of the pay, cloathing, and contingent expences of the disembodied militia in Great Britain, and to grant allowances in certain cases to subaltern officers, adjutants, quartermasters, surgeons, surgeons'-mates, and serjeant-majors of militia, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two.

An Act to defray, until the twenty-fifth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, the charge of the pay and cloathing of the militia of Ireland, and for making allowances to officers and quartermasters of the said militia during peace.

An Act for establishing regulations respecting certain parts of the proceedings in the Court of Session, and in the Court of Commissioners for Teinds, and respecting the duties, qualifications, and emoluments of certain clerks and other officers of the said Courts.

An Act for the better regulation of the Courts of Admiralty in Scotland, and of certain proceedings in the Court of Session, connected therewith.

An Act for giving greater facility in the prosecution and abatement of nuisances arising from furnaces used and in the working of steam engines.

An Act for declaring valid certain indentures of apprenticeship and certificates of settlements of poor persons in England.

An Act to exclude persons holding certain judicial offices in Ireland from being Members of the House of Commons.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act, made in the Parliament of Ireland, in the eleventh and twelfth years of the reign of King George the Third, for preventing frauds committed by bankrupts, as inflicts capital punishment on certain offences therein specified, and to provide more suitable and effectual punishment for such offences.

An Act for the better regulation of the public notaries in Ireland.

An Act to repeal so much of two Acts, made in the Parliament of Ireland, in the ninth year of Queen Anne, and in the seventeenth year of King

George the Second, as inflicts capital punishment on persons guilty of stealing to the amount of five shillings, out of or from shops, warehouses, and other out-buildings and places, and to provide more suitable and effectual punishment for such offences.

An Act to make more effectual provision for the establishment of asylums for the lunatic poor, and for the custody of insane persons charged with offences in Ireland.

An Act for further improving the roads between London and Holyhead, by Coventry, Birmingham, and Shrewsbury.

An Act to rectify mistakes in the titles of two Acts passed in the present session of Parliament, the one for continuing the term of an Act of His late Majesty's reign, for repairing the road from Foston-bridge, in the county of Lincoln, to Little Drayton, in the county of Nottingham; and the other for repairing the road from Newark-upon-Trent, in the said county of Nottingham, to join the road in the said Act mentioned near Bingham, in the said county of Nottingham.

An Act for erecting the town of Airdrie, in the county of Lanark, into a burgh of barony, paving, lighting, and improving the same, and establishing a police therein.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Stratford-upon-Avon Canal Navigation to subscribe a further sum of money for the purposes of the said navigation.

An Act for giving further powers to the Company of Proprietors of the River Arun Navigation, and for confirming certain agreements entered into between the said Company and the Company of Proprietors of the Portsmouth and Arundell Navigation.

An Act for making and maintaining a rail-way or tram-road from Stratford-upon-Avon, in the county of Warwick, to Moreton-in-Marsh, in the county of Gloucester, with a branch to Shipston-upon-Stour, in the county of Worcester.

An Act for altering and enlarging the powers of several Acts of His late Majesty King George the Third, for improving the drainage of the Middle and South Levels, part of the Great Level of the Fens called Bedford Level, and other lands therein mentioned; and for improving the navigation of the River Ouze, in the county of Norfolk, and of the several rivers communicating therewith.
