Tangier, Oltob. 6 Small Algerine, having taken an Englifh Merchant Ship, bound for Sancta Cruz, and carried her to Sally,(to which Government the Algerine pretended to revolt) the late Ambafiador from the Emperor of Morocco in England, (who hap-

pened to be there at that time on occafion of a great Falt, during which the Moors are by their Law forbid to Travel) upon notice of it, cauled the faid Ship to be fecured, and write to the Emperor his Malter, to acquaint him with the Action of the Algerine, which the Emperor underltanding, was highly offended, and lent Orders for the Reiforing the Ship and Goods, and that all 'ablevelments fhould be made good upon pain of death. We have tikewile an account that the Emperor having fome days betowe received Letters from his faid Amballador, containing a Relation of his Reception, Entertainment, and Proceedings in England, he had thereupon called together his Aleaids and principal Governors, and had declared to them the bigh Satisfaction and Honour he had received from His Majelty of Great-Britian, end commanded them to be Withefley for him, "That as long as he lived he would fludy to improve the Friendfhip that was begun betweenthem, and that as foon as the Antbalfador fhould arrive at Court, he would Raitifie the Treaty he had soncluded, declaring farther, That he purpoled so make the faid Ambalfador Aleaid of Alearar, under whole Government are all the places and Countreys from Livan to Sally, and the Country about this Ciry. Bruffets, Nov. 13. We are told that the Marquifs de Grana has received an account from Monficur del Pal, his Minifter at Paris, That there is little likelihood of his obtaining a Prolongation of the Term, and that his Excellency has thereupon fent an Express to the Hague, to acquaint the Spanish Envoy therewith, and to direct him to call upon the States General for their affishance in cafe things thould some to a Rupture. Don Antonio d'Agurto, our Maisfre de Camp General, being returned from visiting Luxemburg, Limburg, and the Garifons in Gelderland, has made report to bis Ex-

cellency of the condition he found those places in and as for Luxemburg, we are informed he has allured his Excellency that it is provided with all things neceflary for a long Defence; however his Excellency has resolved to add to the Garison that is at present there, the Walloon Regiment, Commanded by the Count de Taby, and 300 Spaniards of Moncade's Terie, making together 800 Men; and they have Orders to march immediately thither, and if they cannot have passage through the Countrey; now possed by the French, they are to go round by the way of Trier. Don Antonio d'Agurto, in his return from Luxemburg, faw the Electors of Mentz, Trier, and Cologne, whom the's faid he found in a disposition to i reat with the French upon the Propositions they made many Months fince at Francfort, and in an opinion that it was absolutely ner cessary at this time to establish a firm Peace between the Empire and the most Christian King.

Hague, Nov. 13. Their Highneffes the Prince and Princels of Orange returned hither the 1 th Inflant. The fame day the Members of the States of Holland and Weff-Frizeland began to come to Town; and this day they met for the fifting fince their Receis. The States-General, upon the late Memorial of the Sieur Dieff, the Brandenburg Minifler, concerning the Ship called the Arms of Brand denburg, taken on the Coaff of Guinea, have written very earnefily to the Waff-India Company to have an account of that matter, in order to the giving a fatisfactory aniwer to the faid Minifler. There is a great difpute between the Envoy of this State and the Envoy of the Elector of Brandenburg at the Court of Denmark, concerning precedency, which we hear the former has writ to the States about.

Hague, Nov. 17, We have advice that between 4 and 500 Men of the Elector of Brandenburg's Troops (who embarked on feveral light Frigats at Gluckstadt) have landed in East Frizeland, and have p. Meff. d themfelves of Greitzeil, lying at the mouth of the River Ems, which his Electoral Highness declares he has done according to the obligation that lay mon him as Confervator of that Country, to focuse it against the evil defigns there are to bring Foreign Troops to Quarter upon it,

Park, Novi. 14. On Monday next the Court removes from Fontainbleau to Verfailles. From Turin we have advice, That 3000 French Horfe-are posseful of the Quarters aligned them by the Duke of Savoy in purfuance of the def. nave Alliance concluded between our King and his Highness, which gives great jealousie to the Milaneze and to the Genouefes. The 12th Instant the Parlemens was opened here with the usual folemnity.
