And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered by the Justices of the said borough, to any person who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the King, that, on Wednesday the 15th day of August last, Paul Armstrong, late of the township of Cotherston, in the north riding of the county of York, labourer; Thomas Lowe and John Currah, both of St. John's Chapel, in the county of Durham, miners, with divers other persons, to the number of forty, armed with guns, unlawfully and tumultuously assembled on certain moors in the parish of Grinton, in the said riding, with an intention mutually to assist each other by force against the authority of the law; and the said Paul Armstrong did threaten to take away the life of one Simon Peacock; and that the said Paul Armstrong also stands charged with divers crimes and misdemeanors, and divers warrants have been from time to time issued for his apprehension, which it hath hitherto been found impracticable to execute; and the said Paul Armstrong, Thomas Lowe, and John Currah have absconded; and that, on Thursday the 9th day of the said month of August, three persons, armed with fire arms, and one of them having his face blacked and being otherwise disguised, did assemble and appear upon an open heath or common, called Egleston Common, in the said county of Durham, contrary to the Statute in that case made and provided;

His Majesty, for the better bringing to justice the said offenders, doth hereby offer His most gracious pardon to any one of the persons so unlawfully and tumultuously assembled in the said parish of Grinton, on the 15th day of August last (except the said Paul Armstrong, Thomas Lowe, and John Currah), who shall give such information as shall lead to the apprehension of them, the said Paul Armstrong, Thomas Lowe, and John Currah, or either of them; and also to any one of the three persons so assembled on Egleston Common aforesaid, on the said 9th day of August last (except the man in disguise), who shall give such information as shall lead to the apprehension of the said man in disguise.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered to any person who shall apprehend the said Paul Armstrong, and lodge him in any of His Majesty's

gaols; and a further reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is also hereby offered to any person who shall apprehend the said person who so appeared armed and disguised on Egleston-Common, and lodge him in any of His Majesty's gaols, so that the said parties respectively may be dealt with according to law.—The above rewards to be paid immediately after the parties are lodged in gaol by Mr. Wheldon, Solicitor, at Barnard Castle, and Mr. Tomlin, Solicitor, at Richmond.
