HE Cardinal Colonna is arrived liere from Rome, and has been to make his Compliment to the Great Dake. The Refidents of France, and of Spain, at Genoua, have had Audience of that Senate ; the full, to acquaint them, That the most Christian King had given Orders to the Commanders of his Men of War to Vifit the Ships belonging to that State, to fee that they have no Ammunition or Provisions on Board, defigned for the Assistance of Argiers: and the other to complain that the Genouele Convoy, at its late arrival at Ca-diz, had not faluted that Port, as has been ufual. The Postmasters upon the Road to Pignerol have | Orders to keep good Horfes in readinefs, which makes them expect a Visit from Monsieur de Louwoy; The French Troops continue to pais from Dauphine thither, which gives the Governor of τυoy; Milen great jealoufic, and he has therefore refolved to raile 4000 Men for the Security of the Froptier Garifons.

Viernt, Nou ages The Palatine of Hungary having separated the Troops that were under his command, and put them into Winter-Quarters, is arrived here with fome others of the Chief of the Nobility of Hungary, with whom the Emperor is willing to confult about providing Quarters for the I.np. rial Troop. As yet General Caprara continu.s Encamped near Trenchin, and will remain there as long as Count Teckeley keeps the Field. The Berg-Towns are ftill in his hands, but the Perfons appointed by the Emperor to look after the Mines, are permitted to go ou with their work as formerly; in confideration of which, they are to pay hun a certain Sum Monthly.

^{*} Zell, Novemb. 20 On Monday laft. out Duke received a Letter from the Princels of Eafl-Frizeband, giving him an account, that 400 Men belongfing to the Elector of Brandenburg, had poffeffed themfelves of Grietziel, obliging a finall Garifon of 18 Men, that was there, to quit the place; and that afterward 300 Danifh Dragoons likewife arrived, and took their Quarters in the Neighbourhood: This News has occalioned feveral dilcourfes here, but as yet it does not appear that our Duke will concern himfelf in this Affair, otherwife then so endeavour by his Mediation, to put an end to the Differences that are depending between the Princels, and the States of that Country.

Francfort, Nov. 22. The Courier which the French Ambaliadors fant to Paris, upon the Application that was made to them on the part of the Deputies of the Empire, for the continuing the Negotiation after the expiration of the Term, is not yepreturned; but in the mean time the French Ambaffidors declare, That they do not expect any Alteration of the Orders they have to leave this place the beginning of the next Month, and therefore they prepare for their departure. This City has hitherto declined entring into the Alliance that the Circle of Franconia (of which it is a principal Member) has lately made with the Emperor, being definous in remain Neuter, and therefore will receive no Troops but luch as are raifed by themfelves.

Cologne, Novemb. 24. The Deputies of Liege are not yet arrived, but expected every day. From Francfort they write, That the French Ambalfadors were preparing to leave that place, and to return home, according to the orders they had, which they feemed confident would not be altered.

they feemed confident would not be altered. Bruffels, Nov. 20. This place is now fomewhat empty, all Officers from the higheft Quality to the loweft being in their respective Garifons; and it's faid that in case the most Christian King does not prolong the Term, his Excellency will go to Gaunty (where the Palace is preparing for his reception) for that it's believed, That if the French Troops make any Incurfions, it will be on that fide. From Luxemburg we have advice, That the French Troops are preparing to take their old Poffs about that City, in order to block it up, which we are the lefs concerned at, for that the place is very well fored with Provisions, and that the Garilon, with the laft Supplies that were fent from hence, confills of 3500 effective good Men. From Lille they tell us, That there is a difcourfe that a Chamber of Re union will be fet up there, in the fame manner as at Metz and Brifac, and that the French ip ak of fixing a Quarter at Deinfe. Don Antonio de Medrano, upon some diffatisfaction, has quitted his Government of Newport, which his Excellency has disposed of pro Interim, till the King does appoint a new Governor.

Bruffels, Nov. 24. We have an account, of Count Tilly's arrival with his Regiment and the 300 Spaniards at Luxemburg : About five Leagues from the place they met with a Party of French Horie, and two Battalions of Foot; the Officer that command, ed them d manded of Count Tilly, how he came to pais with fuch a Body of Men through the French Territories, without notice first given, and leave obtained; to which the Count only answered, That he was to obey his Orders: The French Officer asked again, whether in cafe he fhould oppole his Paffage, he had Orders to force it, but the Count gave the fame Anfwer as before, That he must obey his Orders; and the French permitted them to pais freely, without giving them any diffurbance, contrary to their expectation. A Council of War being held at Namur for the Trial of the Count de la Tour, for dilobeying his superiour Officer, they have pronounced Sentence, by which the faid Count is deprived of his Command, (he being Lieutenart Chlonci

Colonel of a Regiment) condemned to pay the. whole charge of the Council, which amounts to 20000 Gelders, and required to make a Submiffion, and beg Pardon of his Colonel, and to remain a Prisiner till he has fatisfied the faid Sentence. His Excellency has received, in Bars of Silver, and Pieces of Eight, an hundred thou fand Crowns from Spain.

Hague, Nov. 27. The 25th Inftant the States of Holland were again compleatly allembled, his II ghness the Prince of Orange being present in their Assembly. Out Letters from France give us an account, That the Swedish Minister at that Court having, in a late Audience he had of the King, preffed his Majefty to give order for the Payment of the Arrears of Sublidies due from his Majefty to the Crown of Sweden, the King had Anfwered, That he had a General Discharge from the King o' Sweden; which the faid Minister seeming furprized at, the King had added he would fhew it him, and then took out of his Pocket the Copy of the Alliance lately concluded between the Em-peror and the King of Sweden.

The last Week the Marquis de Paris, Nov. 25. Boufflers, upon an Order he received from the King, parted from hence in great hafte, and it's faid is gone for Luxemburg: and we are informed that Or-ders have been fent to the French Troops in those Quarters to take the fame Pofls they had during the Blockade of Luxemburg the laft year, and that the Inhabitants of the County of Chinay have been forbid upon very fevere Penaltics to carry any Provifions to Luxemburg. At Thoulon four Men of War are fitting out, who are to relieve the Ships com-manded by the Chevalier de Lery, which Monheur du Quesne lest before Argiers.

London, November 22. On Sunday Night a arcadful Fire broke cut in Cinamon-Lane in Wapping, occasioned by the carelesness of an idle Fellow, which burnt fo furioully, the Wind blowing very hard at South West, that notwithstanding the great Care and extraordinary Endeavours that were used, it confumed many hundred Houses, and was not quite overcome and extinguished till Monday at N ght.

Whitebal, Novemb. 22. His Grace the Duke of Hamilton, having on the 25th of September last, in T Chapter then held at Whitebal by the Sovereign and fix of the Knights Companions, been elected into the Society of the most Noble Order of the Garter; the faid Election was fignified to him by the Chancellor of the Garter. On the second Inflant, his Grace arrived here from Scotland, and on the 4th in a Chapter held at Whitebal, having first received the Honour of Knighthood, he was invefted with the Garter and Leffer George; and Yefferday he was honourably Inftalled at Windfor, the Duke of Ormond and the Duke of Grafton being the Sovereigns Commissioners for the performance of that Ceremony, and the Duke of Richmond, the Earl of Darby, the Earl of Denbeigh, with divers other Perfons of great Honour, affilting thereat; who were afterwards molt nobly entertained at a great and splendid Feast,
