The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**T** is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament be prorogued from Thursday the twenty-ninth day of this instant November, to Thursday the third day of January next.

### By the KING. A PROCLAMATION.

#### GEORGE, R.

7HEREAS We have thought fit to order, that certain pieces of copper money should be coined, which should be called "farthings," every such piece having for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius IIII, Dei " Gratia," and for the reverse the figure of Britannia, represented sitting on a rock in the sea, holding a trident in her left hand and branch of olive in her right hand, with the inscription " Britanniar: Rex: Fid: Def:" and the date of the year: And whereas pieces of copper money of the description aforesaid have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there; We have, therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Proclamation; and We do hereby declare, ordain, and command, that all such pieces of copper money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and

money of the said Kingdom; every such farthing piece as of the value of one farthing of like lawful money: Provided that no person shall be obliged to take more of such pieces, in any one payment, than shall be of the value of six pence.

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Given at Our Court at Carlton-House, this fourteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, and in the second year of Our reign.

#### GOD save the KING.

THE following Address, from the British Residents at Saint Petersburgh, has been received by the Marquess of Londonderry, K. G. one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from the Right Honourable Sir Charles Bagor, G. C. B. His Majesty's Ambassador at that capital, and presented by His Lordship to the King, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:

To His Most Gracious Majesty George the Fourth, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, KING, Detender of the Faith, &c. &c.

#### SIRE,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the British Merchants and others resident in Saint Petersburg and its vicinity, in the Empire of Russia, humbly beg leave to embrace the present opportunity of expressing our sincere and unfeigned attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government.

fit to issue this Proclamation; and We do hereby declare, ordain, and command, that all such pieces of copper money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful lawful recent solemnities of the latter had so long adorned: That its brightness and splendoor will not be at2254

nished in the hands of your Majesty, the unparalleled glory and lofty pre-eminence to which the British empire has been exalted in the scale of nations, during the period that your Majesty, as Prince Regent, conducted the reins of Government, furnish a sufficient pledge and guarantee upon which our hopes for the future may securely rest.

That your Majesty may long continue, under the Divine blessing, to wield the sceptre of your ancestors, and to reign in the hearts of an affectionate and loyal people, upholding by your authority and illustrating by your example, those unalterable principles of the British Constitution, which are the boast of our own country and the admiration of others, is the earnest prayer of your Majesty's most faithful and obedient servants and subjects.
