His Majesty's Consul residing there, and has been presented by his Lordship to the King, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously :

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the undersigned, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects now resident at Boston, in the United States of America, and its Vicinity.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's ever dutiful and loyal subjects, now residing at Boston, in the United States of America, and its Vicinity, but unshaken in our allegiance and affection to your august Person, beg leave humbly to approach your Throne, and offer our sincere and hearty congratulations on the recent auspicious and glorious event of your Majesty's Coronation.

Far removed from our beloved native country, we feel, with pride and gratitude, that there is no spot in the civilized world uncheered by the splendour of our Sovereign's crown, or where your Majesty's faithful subjects may not derive honour, happiness, and protection from its benignant and resistless influence.

We pray your Majesty graciously to accept our warm assurances of firm attachment to your Person and Government, and to the venerated Constitution of the British empire as by law established.

Fervently rejoicing at the enthusiastic feelings of loyalty and satisfaction which the reiterated proofs of affection and confidence, given by your Majesty to your loving subjects, have recently elicited, and firmly relying on the vigour, wisdom, and integrity of your Majesty's Councils and the Legislature of the British empire, we regard with more indignation than alarm, the wicked machinations of those few perturbed spirits who are incessantly striving, to disseminate discontent, disloyalty, and irreligion ;

whom no concessions could tranquilize, no clemency conciliate, and in whom no virtues could excite one sentiment of admiration or approval.

We supplicate Almighty God to pour down upon your Majesty every earthly blessing, and to grant that you may long continue to reign over our happy country, the pride and glory of your people, and the admiration of the world.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Chief Citizens of your ancient and loyal City of Hereford, humbly desire to offer to your Majesty our sincere and cordial congratulations on the joyful occasion of your safe return to your native realms, after diffusing amongst your faithful subjects abroad, the happiness of a personal knowledge of their Sovereign.

It has been your Majesty's glory, in your progress thither, to receive from other countries, especially from that which has been supposed naturally most inimical to Great Britain, the expression of those sentiments of high and grateful respect to which your Majesty's magnanimity has a just and strong claim. We have sympathised, Sir, in the universal feeling of joy which has pervaded every place honoured by the presence of a Prince, whose wise Councils, and whose irresistible arms have rescued and preserved Europe, and conferred on his own dominions the blessings of durable peace.

In returning from the shores of the sister island, where the benignant influence of your Majesty's

presence inspired our hearts with that harmony and concord, as well as enthusiasm, which every where encircled your Majesty's person. WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued unto Thursday the third day of January next; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, in the said third day of January next, to Tuesday the fifth day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor that a part of Our aforesaid Kingdom called Great Britain, do prepare commissions for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall on the said fifth day of February next be held, and sit for the dispatch of business, and important affairs; and the Judges, Serjeants at Law, and the Knights, Barons, and Burgesses, and the Commons, shall be required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fifth day of February next.

AND the Right Honourable the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain, the tenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, did certify the second year of the Majesty of Our said Majesty King George the Fourth, to give to the Secretary of War, as to the necessary directions hereunto respectively.

AT the Court at Carlton-House, the 14th of November 1821,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the fifth of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant November; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth day of this instant November), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place within the dominions of the King of Spain, or to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar), or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or place, or ports or places in His Majesty's territories or possessions on the Continent of North America, or in the territories of the United States of America), or ship or lade any gun-powder

or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places within the dominions of the King of Spain, or into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted) without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by any Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition," and also by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of sundry stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunitions which prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
