WE, the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Commonalty of the City of Coventry, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, in Council assembled, impressed with sentiments of the deepest veneration and regard, humbly beg leave to approach the Throne, and offer to your Majesty our very sincere and ardent congratulations on your Majesty's return from your late visits to your Majesty's loyal and affectionate subjects in Ireland and Hanover, which happy event we attribute to the special protection of Divine Providence, in a season of so much peril, and which has proved so awfully calamitous to many of your Majesty's loyal and attached subjects.

also bear the arms of Stanley, quarterly with those of Sloane, Stanley in the first quarter; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

The King hath been pleased to grant unto Lieutenant-Colonel Michael M'Creagh, a Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Knight of the Royal Portuguese Order of the Tower and Sword, and late a Brigadier-General in the Portuguese Service, his royal licence and authority, that he may accept and wear the insignia of an Honorary Knight Commander of the said Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, which His Most Faithful Majesty has been pleased to confer upon that Officer, in testimony of His royal approbation of the distinguished services rendered by him while serving in the Portuguese army; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

We, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in execution of the powers vested in us, in and by the said Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be extended to the articles of

Pigs' Chaps, Pigs' Faces, and German Sausages, legally imported or brought into the port of London (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies); and that such pigs' chaps, pigs' faces, and German sausages should be added to the list of goods, wares, and merchandise enumerated and described in the table annexed to the said recited Act, marked (E), and that such pigs' chaps, pigs' faces, and German sausages should be lodged and secured at or in such warehouse or warehouses, under the regulations and directions of the said Act: and we do further declare, that from and after the publication of this our certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the directions of the said Act, all and every the provisions, regulations, and restrictions of the said Act shall extend, and be construed to ex-

end to all such pigs, chaps, pigs' faces, and German sausages, in every respect in as full and ample a manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the table annexed to the said Act, marked (E), at the time of the passing of the same Act.
