Carlton-House, February 4, 1822.

This day had audience of His Majesty, the Count Saint Martin D'Aglié, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sardinia, to deliver his new credentials; Monsieur de Souza, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Portugal and the Brasil, to deliver his letters of recall; and the Baron de Werther, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Prussia, to deliver his credentials: to which audiences they were severally introduced by the Marquess of Londonderry, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehall, February 4, 1822.

(commonly called Viscount Cranborne); the Right Honourable William Henry Fremantle; the Right Honourable Sir George Warrender, Baronet; and Joseph Phillimore, Doctor of Laws, His Majesty's Commissioners for the affairs of India.
