The King hath been pleased to grant unto Sir William Grant Keir, of Montague-Square, in the county of Middlesex, a Major-General in the Army, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, and Knight of the Imperial Austrian Military Order of Maria Theresa, His royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a disposition and deed of

settlement, made and executed by his late maternal great uncle, Thomas Grant, of Blackburne, within the parish of Cumside and sheriffdom of Berwick, merchant in Edinburgh, deceased, take and use the surname of Grant, in addition to and after that of Keir, and bear the arms of Grant quarterly with those of Keir, Grant in the first quarter; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to order, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
