His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felonies above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually set fire to the premises in each of the instances above mentioned), who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
