PRESENT,

The KING's Most' Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth VV year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 38, in-tituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it sliall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall/take place; but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such Order of Council, and from time to time, by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension so long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas it is deemed expedient that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia should be suspended for the space of one year; it is, therefore, ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do take place for the space of one year from and after the date hereof, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia be suspended for the space of one year from the date of this Order.

The Commissioners notify, that between May 1819, the date of the Act of 59 Geo. III, cap. 31, and the 2d day of May 1822, they had liquidated claims under Convention No. 7, to the amount of 2,370,811 francs annual rente, and had delivered their certificates for 65 per Cent. thereon, making a sente of 1,541,184 francs, besides a farther rente for the accumulated interest since the 22d Marche

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1816, according to the respective dates of the liquidation of the said claims. The Commissioners farther notify, that since the 19th of May 1819, the date of the aforesaid Act of Parliament, they have liquidated claims, under Convention No. 13, to the amount of 258,116 francs annual rente, and they have delivered their certificates for 18.6363 per cent, thereon, making a rente of 48,085 francs, besides the interest accumulated thereon since the 22d March 1816, according to the respective dates of the liquidation of the said claims. They farther notify, that there remain unadjudicated 138 claims, amounting to about 9,000,000 francs, which said claims, if they should eventually be substantiated by the proper evidence, and be entitled to a payment in full of the amount claimed, would require a rente of 472,016 francs, whereof 18.6363 per cent. would be 87,966 francs.

The Commissioners farther notify, that there remains in their hands, applicable to the payment of such claims, which include arrears up to the 22d March 1818, a rente of 101,915 francs, together with the interest accumulated thereon since the said 22d March 1818.

The claims now notified as adjudicated since the 22d of January last, together with those before liquidated and rejected, as notified in preceding Gazettes, make a total of 1264 claims, under the two Conventions, liquidated and rejected since the 19th of May 1819, when the Act was passed, empowering the Commissioners to liquidate in England, up to this 19th day of July 1822, being a period of 1150 days.
