The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade between His Majesty's possissions in America and the West Indies, and other places in America and the West Indies," it is enacted, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the schedule marked A, annexed to the said Act, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, that from and after the passing of this Order, all articles per-

mitted by the said Act to be imported into and exported from the ports enumerated in schedule A annexed to the said Act, shall and may be in like manner imported into and exported from the port of Annotto Bay, in the island of Jamaica, on payment of the duties, and subject to the rules, regulations, penalties, and forfeitures enacted by the said Act: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the fourteenth of November last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunpowder, arms, or ammunition, to the places therein specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant May; and whereas it is expedient, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months, (to commence from the thirtieth day of this instant May), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place within the dominions of the King of Spain, or to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), or in the West Indies, or on any part of the Continent of America (except to a port or
