Out Letters from Germany tell us, That the Elector of Brandenling, the Ele-Ctor Palatine, and the Electors of Menty and Cologne, had excused their going to Ratibonne; That the Elector of Trier had declared he would go thither if he found the other Electors did it, and that the Elector of Saxony had promised the Count de Lamberg, the Emperor's Minister at his Court, to attend the Emperor there, if he was not prevented by any extraordinary Accident: And the fame Letters add, That the Electoral Colledge at Ratubonna had resolved to Treat with Monsieur Verjus, the French Envoy, upon the Proposals which the Amballadors of this Crown made at Eraucfort, .
