The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade between His Majesty's possessions in America and the West Indies, and other places in America and the West Indies," it is enacted, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the schedule marked A, annexed to the said Act, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order-in-Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, that from and after the passing of this Order, all articles per-
