PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade between His Majesty's possessions in America and the West Indies, and other places in America and the West Indies," it is enacted, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the schedule marked A, annexed to the said Act, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, that from and after the passing of this Order, all articles permitted by the said Act to be imported into and exported from the ports enumerated in schedule A annexed to the said Act, shall and may be in like manner imported into and exported from the port of Annotto Bay, in the island of Jamaica; on payment of the duties, and subject to the rules, regulations, penalties, and forfeitures enacted by the said Act: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions hereih accordingly.
