A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the second day of January next; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said second day of January next, to Tuesday the fourth day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said fourth day of February next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fourth day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Brighton, the eleventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, and in the third year of Our reign.

Order in Council of the gighteenth of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gunt

powder, arms, or ammunition, to the places me sin-specified, will expire on the thirtieth day of this instant November; and whereas it is expedient! that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty; by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby older, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the thirtieth day of this instant November), pilesume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or animunition, to any pert or place within the dominions of the King of Spaln, or to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streightsquf Gibraltar), or in the West Indies; or on appart of the Continent of America (except to reporter place, or ports or places in His Majustyts few itories or possessions on the Continent of Mosth America, or in the territories of the United Series of America), or ship or lade and gun poweter or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or amminition; on boardany ship or vessel, in balento transporting the same into any such ports or places within the dominions of the King of Spain, or into any such port or place on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), or in the West Indies, or on the Continent of America (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Plivy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His "Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-"powder, or any sort of arms or aminimition, "and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of all piece, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or all munition;" and also
