**T**HE Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, do hereby, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament made and passed in the forty-seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled "An Act for repealing the several Acts for regulating the vend and delivery of coals within the cities of London and Westminster, and liberties thereof, and in certain parts of the counties of Middlesex, Surrey, Kent, and Essex, and for making better provision for the same," give notice of their intention to pay off the several annuities granted in respect of the sum of £3000, part of £39,000, raised under and by virtue of a certain Act of Parliament, made in the forty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Third, intituled "An Act for establishing a free market in the city of London for the sale of coals, and for preventing frauds and impositions in the vend and delivery of all coals brought into the port of London, within certain places therein mentioned," to the person or persons to whom the same may respectively belong, on the 29th day of July next; and that the person or persons entitled thereto may then receive the same, at the Office of the Chamberlain of the said City for the time being, in the Guildhall of the same City; at which time the annuity or annuities payable to such person or persons respectively shall cease and determine, viz.
