THE Exchequer Bills dated in the months of
March and April 1822, viz. 58 Geo. 3,

due thereon, will be paid off on the 26th day

Such bills will be received daily (holidays excepted),
from ten o'clock till one, until and including the

are to be obtained, containing instructions for
arranging the bills. The bearers must endorse each
bill with their usual signatures, and write their
names and residences at the bottom of each list;
and where the names of holders are inserted in bills,
the bearers, not being such holders, must previously
obtain their endorsements. The bearers must
attend to give receipts for the payment.

Payment may be obtained, if required, previous
to the said 26th day of March, upon leaving the
bills for examination one day prior to that on which
such payment is desired.

New bills, bearing an interest of two pence by
the day upon every one hundred pounds, and dated
the said 26th day of March, may be obtained in-

issued on the 27th day of March.
