HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftyseventh year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 57, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty

" to suspend training, and to regulate the quotas of the militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to suspend the calling out of the militia of the United Kingdom, or any part of the United Kingdom, or of any county, riding, shire, stewartry, city, town, or place, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in any year, and to order and direct that no training or exercising of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any county or counties, riding or ridings, shire or shires, stewartry or stewartries, city or cities, town or towns, or place or places, specified in any such Order or Orders in Council, shall take place in any year, any thing contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament relating to the militia, to the contrary notwithstanding: And whereas it is deemed expedient that such training and exercising should be dispensed with in the present year; it is ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the calling out of the militia of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in the present year, be suspended, and that no training or exercising of the said militia do take place in the present year.

year of His Majesty's reign (chapter 104), intituled "An Act to continue, until the thirty-" first day of December one thousand eight hundred " and twenty-four, the bounty to vessels employed " in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights; and to authorise His Majesty to alter the times " for the sailing of the said vessels, and any of " the limitations contained in the Acts for allow-" ing the said bounty," His Majesty is authorised, by any Order or Orders in Council to be issued for that purpose, to suspend, or vary, any or either of the limitations and restrictions contained in the several Acts granting bounties to vessels employed in the fisheries carried on in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights, in such manner as may appear expedient, and as may be expressed and set forth in such Order or Orders in Council; And whereas by an Act, passed in the thirty-second year of His late Majesty King George the Third (chapter 22), it is enacted, "that every ship or "vessel having on board one apprentice for every " fifty tons burthen, every such apprentice not exceeding the age of twenty years, nor being under " twelve years at the time he shall be indentured, shall be deemed properly fitted and qualified, with respect to the number and age of apprentices, " to proceed on the said fishery to the Greenland " Seas and Davis's Streights, and to be entitled to the respective bounties granted by this Act; And whereas it is expedient, that further provision should be made with respect to the number of apprentices to be taken on board ships proceeding to the said fisheries, His Majesty is pleased, by virtue of the authority vested in him by the Act firs, above recited, to order, and it is hereby ordered that from and after the date of this Order, British vessels employed in the fisheries in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights, having on board one apprentice for every one hundred tons burthen of each vessel, every such apprentice not exceeding the age of twenty years, nor being under twelve years at the time he shall be indentured, shall be deemed properly fitted and qualified, with respect to the number and age of apprentices, to proceed on the said fisheries to the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights, and to be entitled to the respective bounties granted by law for the encouragement of the said fisheries; provided that all the other provisions of the laws for regulating the said fisheries be duly complied with: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. "gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirtythird year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2,
intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to
