WHEREAS on the 12th March 1823, a Convention between His Britannick Majesty and The King of Spain was concluded and signed at Madrid, for the purpose of establishing a Commission to consider and to decide upon all Cases that shall be brought before it, properly authenticated, of the Capture and Seizure of British Vessels, or Detention of Property belonging to the Subjects of His Britannick Majesty, from the Declaration of Peace between England and Spain of the 4th July 1808 to the 12th of March 1823; as also upon all Cases that should be brought before it of the Capture or Seizure of Spanish Vessels, or Detention of Property belonging to the Subjects of His Catholick Majesty during the same period, of which the following is a Copy:—

Convention between His Majesty and The King of the Spains for the amicable Adjustment of Complaints respecting the Capture and Detention of British Vessels and Property by Spanish Authorities.

Signed at Madrid, March 12, 1823.

**H**IS Majesty The King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty The King of the Spains, equally animated by the desire of arriving at an amicable adjustment of the various complaints which have been from time to time laid before the Spanish Government, of the capture of Vessels, and seizure and detention of Property belonging to British Subjects, by Spanish Authorities, as well as of other grievances; Their said Majesties have been pleased to name Plenipotentiaries for the conclusion of a Convention for the attainment of this desirable purpose, to wit: His Britannick Majesty, the Right Honourable Sir William à Court, Baronet, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Bath, one of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and

Convenio entre Sus Magestades Católica y Británica, para el Ajuste amistoso de las quejas, sobre apresamiento de Buques y Detencion de Propiedades Britanicas, par Algunas Autoridades Españolas.

Firmado en Madrid, á 12 de Marzo de 1823.

**S**U Magestad El Rey de las Españas, y Su Magestad El Rey del Reyno Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, igualmente animados del deseo de alejar todo motivo de desavenencia entre las dos Naciones, procediendo á un ajuste amistoso de las quejas que en diferentes epocas han sido dadas al Gobierno Español, sobre apresamiento de buques, y detencion de propiedades pertenecientes á subditos Ingleses, por algunas Autoridades Españolas, y otros agravios: han tenido á bien nombrar por Sus Plenipotenciarios, para la conclusion de un Convenio especial sobre dicho objeto, á saber:—Su Magestad Católica, á Don Evaristo San Miguel, Coronel de Infanteria, Ayudante General del Estado Mayor de los Egercitos Nacionales, Secretario del Despacho de Estado: Y Su Magestad Británica,

His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to The King of the Spains; and His Catholick Majesty, His Excellency Don Evaristo de San Miguel, Colonel of Infantry, Adjutant-General on the Staff of the National Armies, and Secretary of State for the Foreign Department:— who, after having communicated their Full Powers, have agreed upon the following Articles.

#### ARTICLE I.

A Mixed Commission, English and Spanish, consisting of Two Members of each Nation, shall be appointed, and meet in London, within Ten Weeks after the signature of the present Convention, or sooner if possible, for the purpose of taking into consideration and deciding in a summary manner, according to equity, upon all cases that shall be brought before it, properly authenticated, of the capture or seizure of British Vessels, or detention of Property belonging to Subjects of His Britannick Majesty, from the Declaration of Peace between England and Spain, of the 4th of July 1808, to the date of the present Convention; and also upon all cases that shall be brought before it, of the capture or seizure of Spanish Vessels, or detention of property belonging to the Subjects of His Catholick Majesty, during the same period.

#### ARTICLE II.

Should any difference of opinion arise amongst the Members of the said Commission, and their votes be equally divided, a reference shall then be made to the Spanish Envoy at the Court of London, and a Law Officer of the Crown to be named by His Britannick Majesty. If these Arbitrators should also be divided in opinion, it shall be determined, by lot, which of the Two shall definitively decide the question.

#### ARTICLE III.

An Assignment of Forty Millions of Rials upon the Great Book, shall, according to the Decree of the Cortes, immediately be made to the said Commissioners, for the payment of such Indemnifications as may be awarded by the Commission. This Sum shall be increased or diminished, as the Decree points out, according as a greater or lesser number of Claims shall be admitted as valid, exceeding, in the one case, or not amounting to, in the other, the whole amount of the Sum in the first instance deposited.

al muy Honorable Sir Guillermo à Court, Baronet, Caballero Gran Cruz de la Orden del Baño, del Consejo Privado de Su Magestad Británica, y Su Enviado Extraordinario y Ministro Plenipotenciario cerca de Su Magestad Católica: —Quienes, despues de haberse comunicado sus respectivos Plenos-poderes, han convenido en los siguientes Articulos.

#### ARTICULO I.

Se nombrará una Comision Mixta, Española é Inglesa, compuesta de dos Individuos de cada Nacion, la cual se reunirá en Londres, dentro de diez semanas despues de firmado el presente Convenio, ú antes si fuere posible, con el objeto de tomar en consideracion y fallar sumariamente, conforme á equidad, sobre los casos que se la presenten, acreditados en debida forma, de apresamiento ó captura de Buques Ingleses, y detencion de propiedades pertenecientes á Subditos de Su Magestad Británica, desde la declaracion de Paz entre España é Inglaterra, de 4 de Julio de 1808, hasta el dia la fecha de este Convenio; é igualmente sobre los casos que se sometan á la misma, de apresamiento ó captura de Buques Españoles, y detencion de propiedades pertenecientes á Subditos de Su Magestad Católica, durante el indicado periodo.

#### ARTICULO II.

Si ocurriese alguna diversidad de opiniones entre los individuos de la Comision referida, y se empatasen los votos, se someterá el caso á la decision del Ministro Plenipotenciario de las Españas en Londres, y de un Magistrado de la Corte nombrado al efecto por Su Magestad Británica. Mas si tambien se empatasen los votos de estos Arbitros, la suerte designará cual de los dos deberá tener voto de preferencia que decida definitivamente la cuestion.

#### ARTICULO III.

Se pondrá inmediatamente á disposicion de dichos Comisionados, una asignacion de cuarenta millones de reales, inscriptos en el Gran Libro de la deuda pública, para pago de las indemnizaciones que determinen los mismos. Esta cantidad se aumentará, ó disminuirá, como indica el Decreto de las Cortes de 9 de Enero del presente año, segun fuere mayor ó menor el número de reclamaciones que se admitan como válidas, excediendo, en un caso, ó no llegando, en el otro, al total de la suma depositada.

ARTICLE IV.

The Claims of Spanish Subjects which shall be acknowledged just, shall be paid by the British Government either in Stock, or by an Equivalent in Money.

ARTICLE V.

As soon as the Commissioners shall have admitted any Claim as valid, and determined the amount due to the Claimant, they shall assign or transfer, in favour of such Claimant, a portion of the said Rentes equivalent to the Amount awarded, estimating the value thereof according to the current price in London of the said Rentes, at the time of making such assignment or transfer.

ARTICLE VI.

No Claim shall be admitted, which shall not be submitted to the Commission within Six Months after its first Meeting.

ARTICLE VII.

A Person shall be named by each Government, for the selection and transmission of whatever Papers or Documents it may be necessary to forward from Madrid for the consideration of the Commission, and to arrange the transfer of the Rentes, as the respective Amounts shall be awarded.

In witness whereof, We, the Undersigned Plenipotentiaries of Their Britannick and Catholick Majesties, duly authorized by our Full Powers, have signed Two Originals of the present Convention, and have affixed thereunto the Seals of our Arms, in Madrid, this twelfth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three.

ARTICULO IV

Las reclamaciones de Subditos Españoles que fueren reconocidas como legítimas, serán satisfechas por el Gobierno Británico con inscripciones sobre los fondos públicos de Inglaterra, ó bien en metálico.

ARTICULO V.

Luego que los Comisionados hayan admitido como válida cualquiera reclamacion, y determinado la cantidad debida al reclamante, asignarán ó transferirán á favor de el, una parte de dichas Rentes equivalente á la suma decretada, regulando su valor segun el precio corriente que tengan en Londres dichas Rentas, al tiempo de hacer tal asignacion ó traslacion.

ARTICULO VI.

No se admitirá reclamacion alguna, que no se presente á la Comision dentro de seis meses contados desde el dia en que esta se junte por primera vez.

ARTICULO VII.

Cada Gobierno nombrará una persona para escoger y remitir cualesquiera papeles ó documentos que sea necesario enviar desde España á fin de que la Comision referida los tome en consideracion, y para arreglar la traslacion de las Rentas, segun se vayan determinando las respectivas asignaciones.

En fé de lo cual, nos los intrascriptos Plenipotenciarios de Sus Magestades Católica y Británica, autorizados con nuestros Plenos-poderes, firmamos dos originales del presente Convenio, y los sellamos con el sello de nuestras armas, en Madrid, á doce de Marzo, de mil ocho cientos veinte y tres.

A PROCLAMATION.

For giving Currency to the Double Sovereign, or Gold Two Pound Piece.

GEORGE, R.

**W**HEREAS We have thought fit to order, that certain pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called "double sovereigns," or gold two pound pieces," each of which should be of the value of forty shillings, and that each piece should be of the weight of ten pennyweights six grains, and  $\frac{5430}{10000}$  troy weight of standard gold, according to the weights approved of and confirmed by Us in Council, in pursuance of an Act made in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating and ascertaining the weights to be made use of in weighing the gold and silver coin of this Kingdom:" And We have further thought fit to order, that every such double sovereign, or gold two pound piece, so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius III, D: G: Britanniar: Rex F: D:" and for the reverse the image of Saint George, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon, and the date of the year, and on the edge of the piece, in raised letters, the words "Decus et Tutamen. Anno Regni," with the year of the reign: And whereas pieces of gold money of the above description have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose; We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, that the said pieces of gold money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall be called "double sovereigns," or "gold two pound pieces," and shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and every of such double sovereigns not weighing less than ten pennyweights five grains, shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, every such double sovereigns of the value of forty shillings of like lawful money, in all payments whatsoever.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, the nineteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and in the fourth year of Our reign.

**W**HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the twenty-first of February last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS information has been received that the malignant yellow fever that lately prevailed in the settlement of Sierra Leone and the Island of Ascension no longer exists; it is therefore ordered that the Order in Council of the seventeenth of July last, directing all vessels coming from the Western Coast of Africa and the Island of Ascension to the performance of quarantine (which Order was limited in its operation by another Order, bearing date the twenty-second instant, to vessels coming from the settlement of Sierra Leone and the Island of Ascension) be, and the same is hereby revoked: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief, for the time being, of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to repeal certain duties of customs in Great Britain, and to grant other duties in lieu thereof; to grant certain bounties on salted provisions and silk manufactures exported; and to make more effectual regulations for collecting the duties of customs," certain duties are respectively imposed and directed to be levied on chocolate and cocoa paste of the British plantations; and cocoa nut husks, and shells; and on pepper, viz. Capsicum or Chillies, Cayenne, Guinea pepper, and long pepper; and on segars manufactured from tobacco, and on tobacco manufactured imported into Great Britain from foreign parts: And whereas His Majesty is empowered by the said Act to declare and direct by His Order in Council, that certain import duties of customs and excise (of which the duties upon the articles above enumerated form a part), shall be placed under the sole management of the Commissioners of the Customs, or under the sole management of the Commissioners of Excise, as shall be expressed and directed in such Order, and for a time to be mentioned in such Order; His Majesty having taken the same into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and direct that all the several duties upon the articles above enumerated, imposed by the aforesaid Act, in the schedules A. and B thereof, and each and every of them shall be placed and shall be under the sole management of His Majesty's Commissioners of Excise, according to the provisions and directions of the said Act, from the tenth day of October next, during the time that the aforesaid duties shall continue to be payable:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Bottling Wine and Rum, warehoused under the Act of the 4th Geo. 4 Chap. 24, for Exportation.*

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Excise have, with the approbation of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, made the following rules and regulations, to be observed by all persons intending to avail themselves of the provisions of the Act permitting wine and rum to be bottled, viz.

No warehouse to be used for the purpose but such as shall be approved, according to the directions of the Act for depositing exciseable articles on bond.

Rum on no occasion to be bottled or deposited either before or after bottling in the same warehouse or place as wine.

Before the removal of the liquors from the warehouses in which they were stowed on importation to those specially appointed for bottling, six hours' notice in writing to be given to the proper officers, specifying where the liquors intended to be bottled are stored, the name of the ship and master by which and the place whence imported, the name of the bond and the date of the bond, with the mark, number, content, and ullage of each cask, the quality of the wines, and the quantity of the liquors intended to be drawn off.

A like notice to be given before beginning to bottle, specifying also into what seized cases the liquor is intended to be packed, and whether the bottles and corks are of British or foreign manufacture.

The officers to be furnished with the means of weighing and measuring a sufficient number of the bottles before they are filled, to enable them to calculate the content and weight of the whole.

No other liquors than such as are brought to be bottled to be put in the warehouse appointed for bottling. The operation of bottling to be performed within fourteen days after the removal of the liquor to the warehouse for that purpose. The bottles in every instance to be forthwith packed in cases, marked with the names of the

vessels, by which, and the places whence the liquor was imported, and the number of bottles in each case. The lees of wine to be forthwith put into a filtering bag, and when run through to be bottled as soon as possible and packed with the rest, and the refuse immediately destroyed.

Liquors drawn off and bottled in foreign bottles, to be kept distinct from those drawn off into bottles of British manufacture; and packages containing liquors of different importations not to be mixed together.

The exportation of the liquors to take place within three months after they are bottled.
