PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing date the 24th day of September 1814, to establish certain regulations therein set forth, touching the trade and commerce to and from the settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and the territories and dependencies thereof: and whereas His Majesty was pleased by the said Order, amongst other things, to direct that goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, produce, or manufacture of the countries to the eastward of the Cape of Good Hope, legally imported into the said settlement, or into the territories or dependencies thereof, might he exported from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, to the ports of the United Kingdom, subject to the rules and regulations contained in an Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act for continuing in the " East India Company, for a further term, the " possession of the British territories in India, ditogether with certain exclusive privileges; for " establishing further regulations for the govern-" ment of the said territories, and the better " administration of justice within the same; and " for regulating the trade to and from the places " within the limits of the said Company's charter,"

or to any ports or places to which a trade in such articles was permitted to be carried on from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the fifty-fourth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further regulation of " the trade to and from the places within the " limits of the Charter of the East India Come pany," and subject to the rules and regulations in the said Act contained, provided, however, that nothing in that Order contained should extend, or be construed to extend, to permit any vessel, under the burthen of three hundred and fifty tons, to export from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, to the ports of the United Kingdom, any articles the growth, produce, or manufacture of any countries, situated within the limits of the East India Company's Charter: And whereas by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the several laws now in force with respect " to trade to and from places within the limits of " the Charter of the East India Company, and to " make further provisions with respect to such " trade; and to amend an Act of the present " session of Parliament, for the registering of " vessels, so far as it relates to vessels registered " in India," so much of the said Act of the fiftythird year of His said late Majesty's reign, as authorises His Majesty's subjects to carry on trade and traffic to and from the ports and places within

the limits of the said Company's Charter, with all the provisions, restrictions, and limitations in the same Act contained, for the regulation of such trade, and for the disposition in the United Kingdom of all articles manufactured of silk, hair, or cottonwool, or any mixture thereof, imported under the authority of the said last mentioned Act, from any port or place within the limits of the said Company's Charter; and the whole of the said Act, passed in the fifty-fourth year of thereign of His late Majesty, together with certain other Acts, passed in the fifty-fifth, fifty-seventh, and fifty-ninth years of His said late Majesty's reign, and an Act passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty, all which Acts relate to trade to, from, or between ports and places within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company, have been repealed: His Majesty is pleased, in virtue of the power vested in His Majesty by several Acts, passed in the forty-seventh and forty-ninth years of His late Majesty's reign, and in the first year of His present Majesty's reign, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said Order in Council, bearing date the 24th day of September 1814, as relates to the tonnage of vessels importing, from the said settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, its territories and dependencies, to the ports of the United Kingdom, goods, wares, and merchandise, the growth, produce, or manufacture of countries to the eastward of the said settlement; and also so much of the said Order as subjects the exportation of such goods, wares, and merchandise to the provisions of the said Acts of the fifty-third and fifty-fourth years of His late Majesty's reign, be, and the same are, hereby revoked: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that such goods, wares, and merchandise so exported, shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act of the last session of Parliament, so far as the same are applicable thereto, in like manner, as if such goods, wares, and merchandise had been exported from any port or place within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

A PROCLAMATION,

For giving Currency to the Double Sovereign, or Gold Two Pound Piece.

GEORGE, R.

THEREAS We have thought fit to order. that certain pieces of gold money should be coined, which should be called "double sovereigns, " or gold two pound pieces," each of which should be of the value of forty shillings, and that each piece should be of the weight of ten pennyweights six grains, and $\frac{5480}{10000}$ troy weight of standard gold, according to the weights approved of and confirmed by Us in Council, in pursuance of an Act made in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's reign. intituled "An Act for regulating and ascertaining " the weights to be made use of in weighing the gold " and silver coin of this Kingdom :" And We have further thought fit to order, that every such double sovereign, or gold two pound piece, so ordered to be coined as aforesaid, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Georgius" IIII, D: G: Britanniar: Rex F: D:" and for the reverse the image of Saint George, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon, and the date of the year, and on the edge of the piece, in raised letters, the words "Decus et Tutamen. Anno " Regni," with the year of the reign: And whereas pieces of gold money of the above description have been coined at Our Mint; and will be coined there, in pursuance of orders which We have given for that purpose; We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command, that the said pieces of gold money so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and shall be called "double sovereigns," or "gold "two pound pieces," and shall pass and be re-ceived as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and every of such double sovereigns not weighing less than ten pennyweights five grains, shall pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, every such double sovereignas of the value of forty shillings of like lawful money, in all payments whatsoever.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. /HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the twenty-first of February last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act "to empower His Majesty to prohibit the expor-tation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty " to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammuni-"tion;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirtythird year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled " An Act to enable His Majesty to " restrain the exportation of naval stores, and so more effectually to prevent the exportation of " salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when probi-" bited by Proclamation or Order in Council:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act ' to repeal certain duties of customs in Great Bri-" tain, and to grant other duties in lieu thereof; " to grant certain bounties on salted provisions " and silk manufactures exported; and to make " more effectual regulations for collecting the duties of customs," certain duties are respectively imposed and directed to be levied on chocolate and cocoa paste of the British plantations; and cocoa nut husks, and shells; and on pepper, viz. Capsicum or Chillies, Cayenne, Guinea pepper, and long pepper; and on segars manufactured from tobacco, and on tobacco manufactured imported into Great Britain from foreign parts: And whereas His Majesty is empowered by the said Act to declare and direct by His Order in Council, that certain import duties of customs and excise (of which the duties upon the articles above enumerated form a part), shall be placed under the sole management of the Commissioners of the Customs, or under the sole management of the Commissioners of Excise, as shall be expressed and directed in such Order, and for a time to be mentioned in such Order; His Majesty having taken the same into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and direct that all the several duties upon the articles above enumerated, imposed by the aforesaid Act, in the schedules A. and B thereof, and each and every of them shall be placed and shall be under the sole management of His Majesty's Commissioners of Excise, according to the provisions and directions of the said Act, from the tenth day

Before the removal of the liquors from the warehouses in which they were stowed on importation to those specially appointed for bottling, six hours belief in writing to be given to the proper officers, specifying where the liquors intended to be bottled. are stored, the name of the slip and master by which and the place whence imported, the name of the bonder and the date of the bond, with the

the bonder and the date of the bond, with the mark, number, content, and ullage of each cask, the quality of the wines, and the quantity of the liquors intended to be drawn off.

A like bonce to be given before beginning to bottle, specifying also into what seized cases the liquor is intended to be packed; and whicher the bottles and dorks are of British or foreign manufacture?

The officers to be firmished with the means of weighing and measuring a sufficient number of the bottles before they are filled, to enable them to calculate the content and weight of the whole.

No other liquors than such as are brought to be bottled to be pur in the warehouse appointed for bottling. The operation of bottling to be performed within fourteen days after the removal of the liquor to the warehouse for that purpose.
