PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing date the 24th day of September 1814, to establish certain regulations therein set forth, touching the trade and commerce to and from the settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and the territories and dependencies thereof; and whereas His Majesty was pleased by the said Order, amongst other things, to direct that goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, produce, or manufacture of the countries to the eastward of the Cape of Good Hope, legally imported into the said settlement, or into the territories or dependencies thereof, might be exported from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, to the ports of the United Kingdom, subject to the rules and regulations contained in an Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for continuing in the East India Company, for a further term, the possession of the British territories in India, together with certain exclusive privileges; for establishing further regulations for the government of the said territories, and the better administration of justice within the same; and for regulating the trade to and from the places within the limits of the said Company's charter," or to any ports or places to which a trade in such articles was permitted to be carried on from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, under the provisions of an Act, passed in the fifty-fourth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the further regulation of the trade to and from the places within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company," and subject to the rules and regulations

in the said Act contained, provided, however, that nothing in that Order contained should extend, or be construed to extend, to permit any vessel, under the burthen of three hundred and fifty tons, to export from the said settlement, or the territories or dependencies thereof, to the ports of the United Kingdom, any articles the growth, produce, or manufacture of any countries, situated within the limits of the East India Company's Charter: And whereas by an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the several laws now in force with respect to trade to and from places within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company, and to make further provisions with respect to such trade; and to amend an Act of the present session of Parliament, for the registering of vessels, so far as it relates to vessels registered in India," so much of the said Act of the fifty-third year of His said late Majesty's reign, as authorises His Majesty's subjects to carry on trade and traffic to and from the ports and places within the limits of the said Company's Charter, with all the provisions, restrictions, and limitations in the same Act contained, for the regulation of such trade, and for the disposition in the United Kingdom of all articles manufactured of silk, hair, or cotton-wool, or any mixture thereof, imported under the authority of the said last mentioned Act, from any port or place within the limits of the said Company's Charter; and the whole of the said Act, passed in the fifty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty, together with certain other Acts, passed in the fifty-fifth, fifty-seventh, and fifty-ninth years of His said late Majesty's reign, and an Act passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty, all which Acts relate to trade to, from, or between ports and places within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company, have been repealed: His Majesty is pleased, in virtue of the power vested in His Majesty by several Acts, passed

in the forty-seventh and forty-ninth years of His late Majesty's reign, and in the first year of His present Majesty's reign, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said Order in Council, bearing date the 24th day of September 1814, as relates to the tonnage of vessels importing, from the said settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, its territories and dependencies, to the ports of the United Kingdom, goods, wares, and merchandise, the growth, produce, or manufacture of countries to the eastward of the said settlement; and also so much of the said Order as subjects the exportation of such goods, wares, and merchandise to the provisions of the said Acts of the fifty-third and fifty-fourth years of His late Majesty's reign, be, and the same are, hereby revoked: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that such goods, wares, and merchandise so exported, shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act of the last session of Parliament, so far as the same are applicable thereto, in like manner, as if such goods, wares, and merchandise had been exported from any port or place within the limits of the Charter of the East India Company:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to repeal certain duties of customs in Great Britain, and to grant other duties in lieu thereof; to grant certain bounties on salted provisions and silk manufactures exported; and to make more effectual regulations for collecting the duties of customs," certain duties are respectively imposed and directed to be levied on chocolate and cocoa paste of the British plantations; and cocoa nut husks, and shells; and on pepper, viz. Capsicum or Chillies, Cayenne, Guinea pepper, and long pepper; and on segars manufactured from tobacco, and on tobacco manufactured imported into Great Britain from foreign parts: And whereas His Majesty is empowered by the said Act to declare and direct by His Order in Council, that certain import duties of customs and excise (of which the duties upon the articles above enumerated form a part), shall be placed under the sole management of the Commissioners of the Customs, or under the sole management of the Commissioners of Excise, as shall be expressed and directed in such Order, and for a time to be mentioned in such Order; His Majesty having taken the same into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare

and direct that all the several duties upon the articles above enumerated, imposed by the aforesaid Act, in the schedules A. and B. thereof, and each and every of them shall be placed and shall be under the sole management of His Majesty's Commissioners of Excise, according to the provisions and directions of the said Act, from the tenth day of October next, during the time that the aforesaid duties shall continue to be payable:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the twenty-first of February last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Straights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to transporting the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf, first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition, and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying coastwise of salt-petre, gun-powder, or any sort of arms or ammunition;" and also by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 2, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval stores, and more effectually to prevent the exportation of salt-petre, arms, and ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Com-

missioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. WHEREAS information has been received that the malignant yellow fever that lately prevailed in the Settlement of Sierra Leone and the Island of Ascension no longer exists; it is therefore ordered that the Order in Council of the seventeenth of July last, directing all vessels coming from the Western Coast of Africa and the Island of Ascension to the performance of quarantine (which Order was limited in its operation by another Order, bearing date the twenty-second instant, to vessels coming from the Settlement of Sierra Leone and the Island of Ascension) be, and the same is hereby revoked: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief, for the time being, of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st of July to the 30th September 1823, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On the 3d, 4th, and 5th of next month, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On the 6th, 8th, 10th, 11th, and 12th of next month, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

On the 13th and 15th of next month, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attornies.

After which the lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and bring with them an affidavit as required by Order in Council of 30th July 1819, the forms of which were published in an advertisement from this Office, dated 16th September 1819, and may be procured at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, the said Attornies are to produce similar affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the half-pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy,

"and their representatives, to draw for and receive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of drawing a bill of exchange for the same upon the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be entitled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 30th of September 1823, will commence paying on the 3d of November; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.

MEM.—Bills of exchange drawn under or by virtue of the Act above recited, are not liable to the stamp duty.

No persons residing out of His Majesty's dominions are entitled to the privileges of this Act.

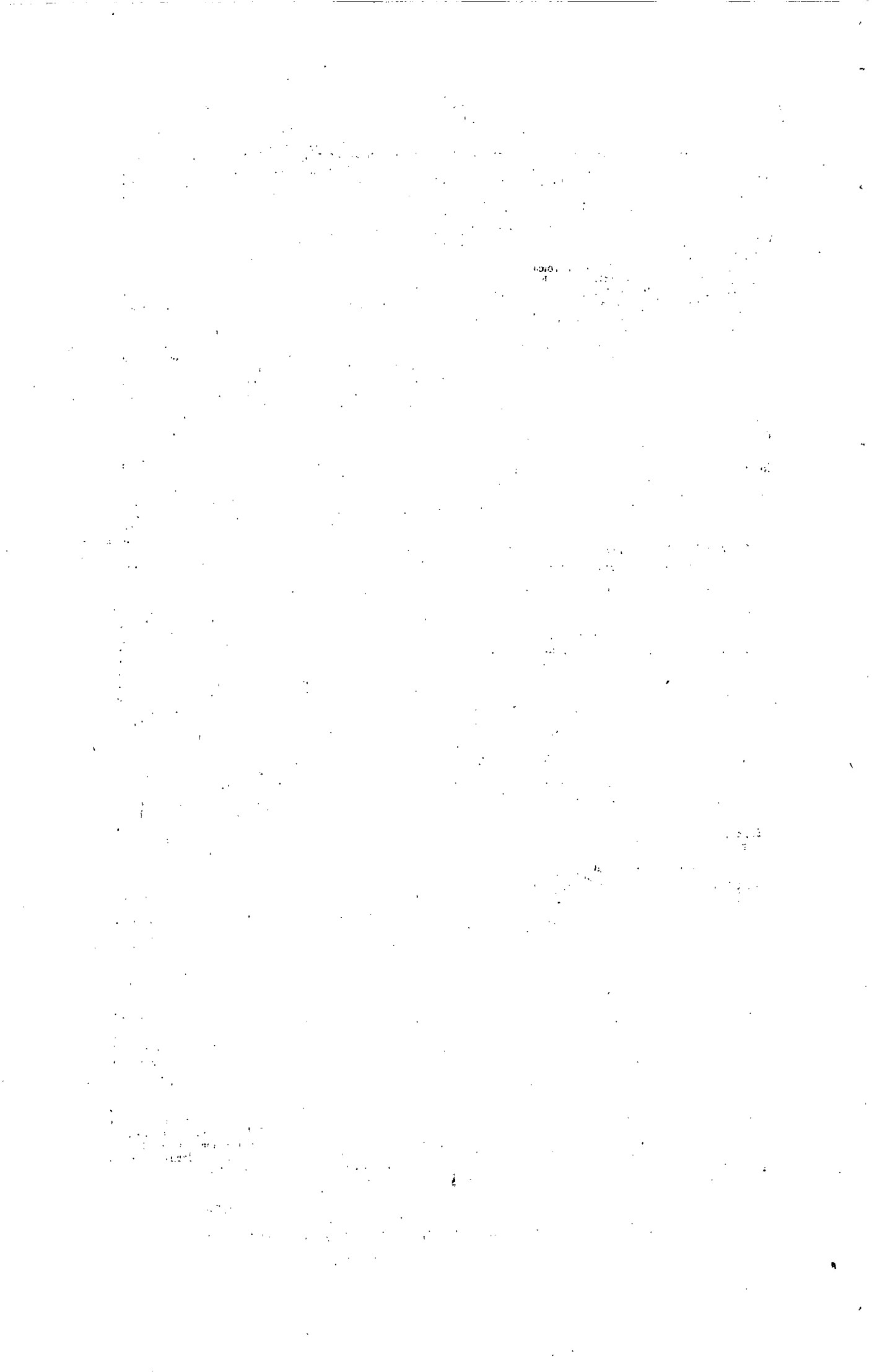
