Vienna, Jan. 31. The Treaty of Alliance, Negotiated by the Baron Leydel, between the Emperor and the Elector of Bavaria, is, it's said, concluded, and an Expres has been sent to Municken to give his Electoral Highness an Account of it. The Preparations for the War are made here with great application, that the Imperial Army may be early in the Field; The Emperor will be himself at the Rendezvous, which is appointed to be the beginning of April. The Letters we receive from Hungary Advise, That the Turks continue to have an Eye upon the Island Schuz, and that we may expect to hear very quickly that they have made a fresh attempt upon it; That Count Teckley was preparing to meet the States of Upper-Hungary at Caschaw, and that he gave out, the chief design of his calling them together, was to give them an opportunity to take such Resolutions as might preserve the Peace between them and the Turks, and that at the same time Count Teckley was Concerting with the Turkish Bassa's, the Preparations for the next Campaign.

Ratisbonne, Feb. 3. The Term which the French King allowed the Count de Crecy to receive the Proposals of the Empire in, being expired, nothing can be done here upon those Resolutions of the Dyet to Treat with him, till he receive new Instructions from the King his Master; In order to the receiving of which, he has, as we understand, sent an Expres to acquaint his Majesty with the said Resolutions of the Dyet, communicated to him by the Imperial Commissioner, the Bishop of Aichstadt, and with the Declaration of the Electoral Colledge, That they do adhere to their Conclusion of the 12th of December, of which he received an Account from the Deputy of Mentz by Order of the said Colledge, together with an Authentick Copy of the said Conclusion of the 12th of December; wherein they declared, That they thought it necessary at this time that a firm Peace should be established.
