HEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the twenty-first of February last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired ; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said probibition should be continued for some time longer, His. Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby outler, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arnis or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or shipl or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to.
